

Do you know how you can answer this invitation? It is by extending it to others whom you care for...


I'll be waiting for all of you to attend my party this year...

I had a heart attack on October 20, 2018. It was a beautiful day! I was out fishing, fortunately only 6 miles out. I had just brought in a nice big grouper. I started to get light headed and I was tired. Then the pain started in my neck and shoulders, and there was tremendous pressure on my chest and I knew I was having a heart attack. We rushed back to shore and the paramedics grabbed me off the boat and on to the hospital.

I have always thought that I was a healthy person. I have regular checkups, I am not overweight, I eat healthy (although, I didn't even get a bite of that grouper), I exercise regularly, and have low cholesterol numbers. Looking back, my blood pressure had been creeping up over the past couple years. I was also tiring easily and I had indigestion, which I attributed to liking hot sauce, a lot! There were plenty of signs, but I wasn't listening because I was a "healthy" person and maybe, just maybe, getting a bit older.



If this sounds familiar, and I say this from the bottom of my double stented heart, go to the doctor! I am now aware of a screening scan that can detect heart blockages for about \$65 (prices vary), but you need a prescription. Had I known this, it could have saved me from ending up in an emergency situation. May the good Lord bless you and keep you in His hands, as He has with me. Thanks for all the love and prayers.


