Lathrop House Rental

The Lathrop House features a historic atmosphere yet provides flexibility in arrangements with available seating for 40. The multi-purpose room of the Lathrop House is one of the Historical Village's "hidden gems". Due to the flexible room arrangements, a modern kitchen and wheelchair accessibility, it is the perfect setting for your next function. It is available for rent year-round, seven days a week.

Wedding showers, baby showers, birthday parties, baptisms, weddings, book signings, office holiday parties, alumni events, and picnics are all some of the events that have been held at the Lathrop House Multipurpose Room. And best of all, the rental rates are very reasonable: Members - \$25/hour, plus deposit. Non-members - \$35/hour, plus deposit.

Other features all included in the rental cost are:

- Seating for 40 with the flexibility of 11 tables to set the room as you wish.
- A full kitchen with a stove, microwave, oven, refrigerator and freezer.
- Dishes, silverware, cups, coffee pots, water pitchers.
- Easy access from anywhere in greater Cleveland.
- Free close-up parking.
- Alcohol is permitted with no additional charge.
- Special needs access.
- Non-smoking facility.
