



The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings w/your children



Today is the last Sunday of the liturgical year, sort of like New Year's Eve.

Today we think about endings, beginnings and what is important. The final Sunday of the church year is the celebration of Christ the King.

When you think of a king, how would you describe him?

In the first reading, we hear about King David, the most beloved King of Israel. King David united the people of Israel, protected them and ruled with justice. Later when the people didn't have a king, they waited and hoped for a king like David.

Jesus isn't just like an earthly king, he is the Godking. He doesn't rule over just one group of people or one country, but for all the earth and all people.

In the second reading we are reminded that all things were created for Jesus and also through him.

In the Gospel we hear about Jesus on the cross. Death did not rule over Jesus. He conquered that by rising from the dead. Jesus shares his life with us through Baptism. With Baptism, we become family of the King which makes us royal too.

In the second reading Paul talks about our inheritance. That inheritance is the kingdom of God.

Living our Faith: Talk to a family member about



your baptism. Ask why you were given your name. Describe what you think the kingdom of God looks like.
