# REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL: THE PARABLE OF THE TALENT DEVELOPING THE GIFT THAT IS ME

The greatest gift we have from God is the gift of life. Well, the gift of salvation probably ranks ahead of it. But let's just focus on life for now. Eleanor Powell was quoted as saying that "Life is God's gift to us. What we become is our gift to God." What we become is our gift to God. That's unequivocally and eternally important, and inspiring above all. Mostly we don't think of our lives as a gift we offer back to God, not just once, but again and again. Sometimes when I pray over the gifts we bring up to the altar at Mass (bread and wine), I pray that God accepts the gift of ourselves that we bring along, too. So, as we reflect on the parable of the Talents, let us focus on the condition of the life (mine and yours) that we give to God.

Everyone loves beautiful gifts, not necessarily the costliest and wellpackaged ones, but definitely the ones that showed the efforts and thoughts put into them. And so does God who definitely delights in us as he did in Jesus. Just as parents often, and mistakenly, try to replace love, care and affection for their kids with material gifts, we sometimes mistake crucial personal, human development with material and career achievements. These constitute just a little portion of who we are and the 'life' that we give back to God.

For example, our society focuses on spectacular talents mostly, which explains the huge success of talent shows like "America's Got Talent." Everyone wants to be like the stars of such shows. Yet, we know that all that glitters is not gold. Some child stars who were catapulted to great heights long ago because of such talents failed to develop the gift of their own selves. They failed to make something of themselves.

Lindsay Lohan is one example of such kids. She is still struggling to reach that vital human development separate from career or talent development. It's never too late. On the other hand, Drew Barrymore, another kid star grew up struggling like Lindsay. Luckily, but more than luck, she put in raw efforts to develop her life and is now doing very well. It takes effort, with failures and successes. It's never too late.

From the religious side we have great saints like St. Augustine who, in a sense, realized that his life was not becoming that much of a gift and decided to make it a worthier gift. With lots of efforts he turned it around. We have Mary Magdalene in the Scriptures who turned her life around and made it a worthier gift.

We too should examine our lives to see if what we're offering to God every Sunday or at every Mass is as worthy as it should be. What can we do to make it worthier or a better gift? Ultimately, as we strive to offer to God a better gift of our lives, the better prepared we are to offer Him a beautiful gift at the end of life. Then we shall receive the greatest gift – eternal life. The Master in the parable of the Talent never kept the gift for himself, he returned it to the servants, along with the interests. So, yes, God will return to us the gift of our lives, with all the interests, and even more added.

"Life is God's gift to us. What we become is our gift to God." Be generous, and you'll have gifts poured into your lap (Luke 6:38).
