

4 Corners Traffic Flow Solution status and plan diagram

April 4th, 2019

Presentation of the proposed solution for 4 corners by Dennis Rodoni, Rhonda Kutter and Bob Goralka from the Supervisor's office and Mia from the Park Service
Approximately 25 community members attended.

Bob presented the revised plan for this intersection. They had previously come in September of 2018 and returned with a plan revision this spring that had a good number of elements asked for by community members at the previous meeting. Among others, some major concerns were through traffic on Panoramic, signage and traffic flow.

They explained that the option of a roundabout would need too much land from the adjoining parks and would not be feasible. As it is the proposed solution may take quite some time to implement due to the necessity to actually do the engineering and planning work for it. Some other similar options from last September also require more space than available. Some community members were concerned about signage and at the same time there is the desire to keep signs smaller and relatively unobtrusive.

One attendee expressed that the issue of the right hand turn "lane" coming up Sequoia was very important to residents of our neighborhood. The new plan had that area striped off. The delegation was receptive to this concern.

The park service reported reduced visits and traffic to Muir Woods, due to parking restrictions and parking enforcement on Frank Valley Road.

Some attendees expressed concerns about driving and vehicle speeds on Panoramic. Supervisor Rodoni stated again that without enforcement there will be no change in behavior. They have limited resources but would put some enforcement up here if we want it.

The design was presented as a plan that was a good start, feasible in the short term and that can be implemented now. This plan does not rule out subsequent improvements and tweaks. On a show of hands and without major objections from attendees, the plan will be put into the pipeline on the engineering side with minor changes as noted at the meeting.

Rodoni's "office hours" were kind of cut short as there were a lot of questions and comments from attendees, though some people did bring up some other issues.
