Last Months minutes were approved as written.

Jim from Clearview Property Management read and answered questions on the on the financial report and the Monthly management report. Both reports were approved by Board.

We have 3 units currently for sale:

Connie Williams gave the pool report. We had to pay a additional fee of \$938.00 for August 9, 2017 filters an filters and cleaning of pool due to lotion and Long hair tangled inside the traps and drains and filters. Peggy Booker questioned How much extra Paul was paid for the month of July. Paul billed a additional \$4,803.38. Most of the charges were for water heater replacement and various repairs....Paul replaced 28 sprinkler heads in July. Dot's Recipe Overnight French Toast

1 cup brown sugar
1/2 cup butter
2 Tbsp. Karo corn syrup
1 tsp. vanilla

3 eggs
1 cup Milk
2 large Granny Smith Apples sliced medium
9 slices day old French bread
(some times I use Italian bread)

In a small sauce pan cook butter, sugar & Karo syrup. Stirring constantly until thickens about 3 to 5 minutes. Pour this into a 9 x13 dish. Arrange apples on top. Beat eggs, milk & vanilla together. Slice bread into 3/4" slices. Poke holes in bread with fork. Dip into egg. Place in dish & bake uncovered for 35 to 45 minutes. Sometimes I sprinkle cinnamon on top.

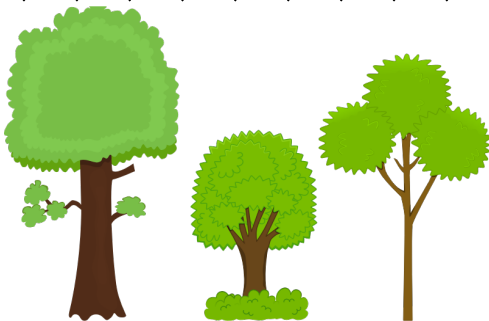
Annual Courtyard Walk a HUGE Success

'Tis the Season For Fall Color Tours

Last year, we talked about fall festivals in September. So, why not get out of your recliner, turn off the TV, and head out to view some spectacular fall scenery, courtesy of Mother Nature and the 20-million-acres-plus of Michigan's forests. And, maybe attend a festival or other event along the way.

Sugar maple, beech and yellow birch, are some of the most colorful.

Forests cover more than 51 percent of the state, and if you've got the time—and most of us do—it's time to plan a trip to witness the annual change.

Here are a couple of worthwhile fall tours, starting with the western Upper Peninsula, where the colors change first, starting this month.

One of my faves is a trip to Porcupine Mountains State Park near Ontonagon. The 60,000-acre park has great overlooks, especially at Lake of the Clouds, affording an excellent look at our largest state park.

From there, head north to Copper Harbor on U.S. 41 to overnight at the beautiful Keweenaw Mountain Lodge, at the tip of the Keweenaw Peninsula. On the way, pass through the Keweenaw Peninsula National Historical Park, home of the former Quincy Mine, which tunnels thousands of feet under you. You can even ride in part way on an underground tour. The western U.P.'s color usually is a peak from mid-September to early October. The closer you are to the warming effects of water, the later the show develops.

On the way east, stop at the Michigan Iron Industry Museum on the way back east in Negaunee, outside Marquette, which is the next region to see fall color, usually peaking in late September to mid-October. Continue heading east through Marquette along MI-28 to Tahquamenon Falls State Park near Paradise. A great brewpub near the falls for lunch or dinner leads to a short walk to the lip of the largest, the Upper Falls.

Accommodations are in Newberry, or push on to St. Ignace for more places to sleep. Fall color's peak usually arrives there around early October. Hop a boat to Mackinac Island and overnight at Grand Hotel, where there are always some good fall vacation packages.

Back on the mainland, get off the freeway and drive south on U.S. 23 along the Lake Huron shore. Duck inland along M-55, or continue south through the vacation towns of Alpena, Harrisville, Oscoda, the Tawas, and the Au Sable River National Scenic Byway near Oscoda, and Silver Valley near East Tawas.

Time your tour to fall's peak, there usually around late September to mid-October. Or, head south on I-75 back towards your recliner around Oct. 6-10 for what's usually a spectacular fall color show between Mackinaw City and Bay City.

Lots of fall color tour information is available online, including local towns offering their own tours, and even Owosso's Michigan Steam Railroading Institute's color tour by rail, Oct. 7 from Kalkaska to Petoskey, and Oct. 14 from Mount Pleasant to Cadillac. And, hopefully, return! You'll get back just in time to pick up some cider at Erwin Orchards in South Lyon. Call on the rail trips—989-725-9464.

**Kick off the season with a glass of
Fall Harvest Hot Apple Cider!**

Ingredients:

- 4 apples (use multiple varieties)
- 2 persimmons
- 1 pear
- 1 orange
- Handful of pomegranate arils
- 9 cups water
- 3 cinnamon sticks
- 2 tbsp mulling spices
- honey or maple syrup to taste



1. Core the apples, persimmons and pears and cut into quarters. Leave the skin on.
2. Cut the orange into slices
3. Pop all of the fruit, along with the water, cinnamon sticks and mulling spices (tie these into some cheese cloth so that they are easily removed), into the slow cooker. Set on low for 8 hours
4. Once cooked, remove the cinnamon sticks, the mulling spices and as much of the fruit as possible
5. Pour the remaining liquid into a blender (I do this in 2 batches), blend, and then pour through a fine mesh sieve (I actually used a nut milk bag), into a clean container
6. Pour the cider back into the slow cooker, and set to keep warm
7. Serve warm, and use some honey or maple syrup to sweeten if required. Garnish with some orange and apple slices and some pomegranate arils to make it pretty (optional).
