April Charity Workshop

The main focus of this workshop will be making rare bears for Rare Science which is an organization striving to accelerate cures for rare childhood diseases. Patterns will be provided...bring your own fabric or use our stash. We will not need to stuff the bears nor fill in eyes and noses - easier for shipping.

Not interested in making a bear? We also would like to help out the St. James Food Bank in Long Branch by making some "ugly" grocery tote bags. The food bank helps folks on the shore whose lives are still disrupted by SS Sandy. The guild has plenty of fabric which could be used for this purpose. In case you would like to make some totes before the meeting, the instructions are on the following page.

As always, charity workshops are also an opportunity to work on personal projects while enjoying the companionship of fellow members. We look forward to a great turnout for a fun afternoon.

Instrtuctions for St. Brigid's "Ugly" Tote Bags

The tote bag will accommodate paper grocery bags (12 w x 7 d x 14 h) or (12w x 7 d x 17 h). They do not have to be exact, and any fabric can be used, as long as it is sturdy enough to hold groceries. These bags are given to clients of the St. James Food Bank.

These are very simple directions – you are welcome to adjust the directions to suit your skill level or fabric weight.

FABRIC: sturdy enough to hold groceries.

44" w folded selvage to selvage by 3/4 yd (27")

CUT: Keep fabric folded.

Cut 21" across. This is the body of the bag.

Cut the remaining 6" piece into two 3" strips. These are the two handles

TO MAKE THE BAG:

- Sew along the two cut edges (<u>not</u> selvage edge) with a ½ inch seam. Clip bottom fold so the seam lays flat.
- Grasp the points and bring together, making sure each side seam matches.
- For each triangle, find the point where the base is 7".
- Stitch each corner along the 7" line. This is the bottom of the bag.
- Unfold the bag to create the bottom, tack down the points (folding and stitching this point down gives the bag extra stability).

TOP EDGE OF THE BAG: Double fold 1" hem, sew all around top of bag.

HANDLES:

- Fold one 3" strip in half. Sew ½ " seams. Press seams open. Zig zag over the sewing line through all fabric layers.
- Or use your favorite method for making sturdy handles. Cut in half, and attach to each side of the bag.

BAG BOTTOM: Cut a piece of cardboard the same size as the bag bottom, and insert.



Courthouse Quilters Exhibit at the Sigal Museum Opening Reception





oin us at the opening reception for the Courthouse Quilters Guild's exhibit at the Sigal Museum, 342 Northampton St., Easton, PA. The reception will be from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. on Friday, April 15. All members of Courthouse Quilters will be admitted free to the museum for the reception. Others will be asked for an optional \$7.00 donation.

The Northampton County Historical & Genealogical Society has given the members of the Courthouse Quilters their 2016 challenge: create authentic artisan quilts inspired by the Society's own rich collection of quilts. This

exhibition celebrates both the rich patchwork tradition of Northampton County and the talent of these contemporary quilters.

How has quilting changed over time? Visit "Courthouse Quilters and Patchwork Tradition" to explore this question and enjoy a colorful and diverse juxtaposition of vintage and contemporary quilts.

If you can't make the opening, you will have plenty of opportunity to view this exhibit. It will run from April 16 through July 31, 2016. The museum's hours are Wednesday to Saturday, 10 am-4pm and Sunday from noon-4pm. Closed Memorial Day and July 4th.



2016 Courthouse Quilters Challenge - "Then and Now"

This year's challenge is entitled *"Then and Now"* and entries must be inspired by one of the quilt blocks shown below. There is an option to exhibit entries at the Sigal Museum in Easton, PA.

The Basics:

The CHQ 2016 Challenge includes two categories: "Quilts" and "Other". "Other" may include wearables, mixed media, or any form of textile art. Members may enter one item per category. Each item must be inspired by one or more of four quilt blocks from historical quilts from the Sigal Museum Collection.

The challenge items are due at the April 2016 meeting, April 10, 2016.

The Sigal Museum Quilt Exhibit:

This year there will be an exhibit of our challenge entries at the Sigal Museum, 342 Northampton St., Easton, PA. The exhibit will begin with an opening reception on **Friday, April 15, 2016**, from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. and will **close on Sunday, August 1**, 2016, with **takedown on August 2, 2016**. All Sigal Museum exhibits can be viewed Wednesdays through Saturdays from 10am to 4pm and Sundays from noon to 4pm.

Members may participate in the guild challenge without showing their quilts in the exhibit.

Requirements:

If you will not be entering your item in the exhibit at the Sigal Museum, these are the requirements:


- The quilt must have been made between September 13, 2015 and April 10, 2016.
- If your quilt was not designed by you or was quilted by someone other than you, the designer or quilter must be named on a card attached to the front of your quilt.

If you intend to submit your entry to the Sigal Museum Exhibit:

- You must be the designer of your entry. If your entry was quilted by someone other than yourself, the quilter must be named in the exhibit.
- Your quilt must have an AQS style hanging sleeve. For instructions see: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=m Vd82aSiAA
- You must bring two copies of the intake form to the April meeting. Your quilt cannot be identified as yours prior to voting, so keep your intake form separate from your quilt until after the competition.
- You must have a label sewn to your quilt with your name and phone number on it. The label must have a piece of fabric over it for the competition.
- You must bring a pillowcase with your name and phone number for transport of your quilt after the competition. Bring the quilt to the meeting in an unmarked bag or pillowcase.
- Ellen will take your quilt home the night of the April meeting, April 10th, and deliver it to the Sigal Museum on Monday morning, April 11th. Your quilt will be in Ellen's home overnight and will not be insured. Once it reaches the Sigal, it will be covered by their insurance.
- Pick up will be on August 2nd at the Sigal. The intake form must be presented to pick up your quilt. Any quilts
 not picked up will be stored in Ellen's home and returned at the August meeting. Again, Ellen does not have
 special insurance to cover these quilts.

Acquisitions

The acquisition committee of Babette Galinak and Jill Ferrari has been busy updating the forms and will have them available for you starting next month.

I would like to draw close attention to the **cut off date for submissions of September 2**nd. In the past the submission date usually was the September meeting.

Because our meeting is not until the Sept. 11th and the show's acquisition day is Sept 27th we had to move up the cut off date to Friday, Sept. 2nd of Labor day weekend. Programs need to be at the printer a minimum of 2 weeks before the show, we apologize for this necessary change. This earlier date will allow for printing of our programs, quilt information cards and the hanging layout to all be done in a timely manner.

Babette and Jill will have acquisition forms starting at our April meeting. You can submit completed forms anytime before the cut off date. We hope to have the majority of the forms way before the cut off date.

Insurance

Insurance for our quilts will be obtained from a new provider this show as NQA ceased to exist as of 1/1/16. Although mentioned before our new policy has a \$1000 deductible on any claims. On the off chance there is a claim it would be helpful to you to have a professional appraisal, without that the carrier may decide only to reimburse the cost of materials and a minimum for labor. Please keep this in mind when valuing your quilt.

Dana has agreed to do appraisals twice this show. She will be available before our September meeting schedule for Sunday September 12 and again on Acquisition Day, Tuesday, September 27th. Her usual fee is \$50 per appraisal but she has generously offered guild members a price of \$40. More information on this will be forthcoming.

Volunteers

Our membership is down to 75 members. This is the lowest it has been in a very long time. We will be very hard pressed to cover all the show jobs unless every member takes on a least one job or more jobs. We do have sitting jobs for those who can not stand for long hours, If there is a particular job you would prefer to do please discuss what you would prefer to do with Joan Lasota or Mary Rigby for jobs before the show or Joanne Gardner for those jobs before or after the show. We will be adding a clean up crew to take-down all our supplies brought to the mill this year. All positions available in previous years plus a few new jobs will count towards obligation to remain a member in good standing.

Lastly a gentle reminder that all members must sell a minimum of \$20 worth of raffle tickets and make or provide three items for our boutique to remain in good standing.

- 5. Your Mini must be handed in by the September meeting. This will give the committee time to get the raffle all set up.


You can turn in your completed mini at any guild meeting to Jill Ferrari or Andrea Cavallaro. If you have any questions contact either Jill or Andrea.
