Standing or Not Standing during the National Anthem has been getting a lot of attention on the nightly news, ESPN, in the newspaper, on social media, from professional sports figures, and at the water cooler at work. As our nation's President let his thoughts become known on the subject this past week the debate continued to escalate. It's good that we live in a free country where anyone who has an opinion can chime in because everyone seems to have an opinion on this issue.

If you have an opinion on the National Anthem then I wonder how strong an opinion you have when it comes to standing up for God. Standing up for God requires an effort of commitment which goes beyond standing up for 60 seconds before a ballgame when an anthem is played. Standing up for God caused three Hebrews to be placed in a fiery furnace. Standing up for God caused Daniel to be placed in a den of lions. Standing up for God caused the apostle Paul to be thrown in prison, for the disciple Peter to be crucified, and for Stephen to be stoned with rocks and left to die because of his faith. But because of the freedom we have to worship in our country it is not likely we will have to give up our life because of our faith. Yet there are possible situations where a Christian might have to make that decision.

But again I ask, are you living a life which stands up for God? Is this of importance to you? If so I ask you to reflect on a few questions?

- 1) Is being in Worship on Sunday morning a priority for you? Or perhaps Sunday sports events which your children or grandchildren participate in are given the nod over standing up for God. Or perhaps working overtime for that extra paycheck is given the nod over standing up. Or perhaps sleeping late after a busy Saturday is given the nod over standing up.
- 2) Is keeping the vows you made to your spouse before God a priority for you? Or perhaps flirting with others, which can often lead to being with other men / women given the nod over standing up for the vows you took. Are the words you speak to your spouse reflective of the vows you took, or is anger or "the cold shoulder" given the nod over standing up for the vows you took.
- 3) Is tithing to God (instead of tipping) a priority for you. Or perhaps the material things of this world have become more important and are now given the nod over standing up for God. How much of God's financial blessings have you returned to God in 2017?
- 4) Do the things you say and the things you choose to do stand up for God? Do you seek to treat others justly, and stand up for justice, or has self-interest or laziness of spirit given the nod over standing up for God and loving one's neighbor.

What God requires is more than standing up for 60 seconds as an anthem is played prior to a ballgame. Yet this secular topic grabs the attention of many and we fail to focus on important spiritual questions. Has our nation become so spiritually dry?

Again I ask, are you choosing to stand up for God? What does your allegiance to him entail? What did it entail for Daniel, Paul, Peter, and Stephen? Can you even give 60 seconds of thought to your answer? Daniel, Paul, Stephen and Peter gave their lives as an answer.
