We all spent 2 hours there and made a transformation in the landscaping, it is now clean, neat and looking nice. I will be buying some new plants to go into the bare spots where dead and dying plants were removed plus new mulch for ground cover. This area is small and easy to maintain with a little weeding and trimming once a month.

Diane Greenwell reported on the Port Authority meeting, they are trying to get grant funds for Reef Balls for an artificial reef off Hernando Beach, they cost about \$250 each. Diane was going to look into ways that Hernando Beach and Weeki Wachee residents could donate towards funding a Reef Ball. There are also memorial reef balls made that are in honor of a deceased loved one. These balls are a hollow cone made of concrete with holes in them that provide a home and haven for fish. They make a great artificial reef that is quickly populated by fish.



deter a thief from targeting your vehicle: Spring Hill, FL 34609

- Always lock your vehicle when you leave it, "Removing valuables and locking your car doors time.
- Never leave valuables in your vehicle (i.e., iPods, cell phones, computers, purses, etc.)
- Do not leave loose change in your vehicle.
- Never leave a firearm in your vehicle. If a thief gets your firearm, he/she is now armed and a greater threat to the community. This is especially true for the deputy that approaches that nowarmed criminal.
- Consider placing a reliable alarm on vehicle(s) and be sure to activate the alarm each time you leave the vehicle.
- Cover newly purchased items and packages to deter theft.





MARCH MADNESS ON THE NATURE COAST

When March begins, the waters of the Nature Coast begin the heating process associated with our area. The fishing begins to heat up as well. The gator trout, redfish, and many other species move into the area to begin the summer pattern. Recreational and sport fishing all pick up in the area. Our summer fun kicks in during this time of the year.

As the migration of tarpon gets going here, so do kingfish who move in closer to shore when the west winds pick up. Cobia come in close to shore moving with the large rays. The creeks come alive with gator trout. This is probably my most favorite time to fish the Nature Coast waters. Snook fishing is a species I especially enjoy because it has the characteristics that I use during bass fishing.

Oyster bars, turtle grass flats, kelp, and rock bars (riprap) around the creek drain-offs is what most of us look for to find most species. Haul Over Creek in Chaz is an example of a drain-off area. North and South Blind Creek has all the benefits that we look for to find most species. Wall Creek (closer to Pine Island) is also an area where fishing is a plus.

Jenkins Creek on the outside and inside areas are also a positive fishing spot. Every area south to Aripeka have the bars and turtle grass necessary for inshore fishing to be successful.

I would like to finish with a story that is dear to me. My wife, Joy, and I owned a boat called the "Blue Goose". On one fishing trip we traveled north to Homosassa. We ran across a dead Cyprus tree that was a half mile northwest of the Crow's Nest. We had several educators and administrators from Hernando County with us. We caught twenty one redfish that were in the twenty to thirty pound range off that tree. This was an exciting day for all of us. (Of course we practiced catch and release for those fish under or over the size limit.)

We need to remember that we are a shallow water community. It is necessary for us to work together to keep the Nature Coast a fishing community for residents and recreational fishermen. This area is not condusive as a seaport. Dredging will occur which will drastically change the fish communities due to a major change in their food chain and habitat. Massive fishing boats would also be a detriment to recreational fishing and bring no benefit to our community.
