

I am the guest Organist for Arvada Lodge #2278 and have been for the past three years. I am also a Ritual Coach for the Officers.

I have been President for the PER Association of Westminster #2227 a couple of times and Secretary for many years. During my 38 years of ELKDOM I have served the Colorado Elks Association in the capacity of either a District or State chairman since 1984.
