I want to thank everyone who took the time to bring in quilts so that we could all enjoy them for quilt month. It has been great to see all the quilts around the square in store windows also. The quilts are beautiful works of art. If you look closely, you can see the talent, time, and patience it has taken to make these gorgeous quilts. We also have a beautiful miniature display of quilts in our case created by Beth Armstrong. It will be on display a little longer, so remember to take a look when you are here.

If you are having trouble using your computer, or would you like to ask questions about computers and have them answered by someone who is knowledgeable and can help? Then we have the person for you. Bo Harvey is holding computer classes here at the library every two weeks at 8:45 a.m. You can bring your own laptop or use one of the library computers. Bo has worked with computers for many years, and has extensive knowledge in all the

Microsoft Office applications. The next class will be held on April 8th.

We have a new printer at the library thanks to a Library Services and Technology Act Grant that we received this year. We can offer scanning and color printing. Scanning services are free up to 5 pages and \$0.25 each page after. Color printing is \$0.50 a copy. We also have two additional public access computers to bring the total available to the public to fifteen.

Dr. Trisha Petty will be at the library in April. If you are a non-writer, a beginning writer, or one who has gotten off track in your own writing, join us on April 27th at 10:00 a.m. in the community meeting room. Dr. Petty will do a seminar on journaling and how it can change your life.

The R.E.A.D.S. program is our Regional eBook & Audiobook Download System. You can log in with your library card number and enjoy eBooks, audiobooks, and even streaming videos on your computer, phone, tablet, or iPod. Even if you don't have the internet at your home, you can come to the library and use our Wi-Fi to download books, audio books, or videos on your device and read, listen, or watch at your convenience. This program is just another way the library is serving the community. You can get more information and help with the R.E.A.D.S. program at the library.
