- Ashlee Chmiel and Antonio Ventry, 350 South 1st Street: Entire yard. Pollinator cottage style gardens with a koi pond, rose garden and berry patch.

- Sean and Nicole Johnson, 310 Merrie Rd: Entire yard. Bird and pollinator friendly cottage style gardens with chemical free perennials. Featuring a waterfall with fish pond, bird house tree, and a mosaic mural made from re-purposed plates. A National Garden Clubs' certified wildlife habitat.
- Miklitsch Merrie Garden, 315 Merrie Rd: Entire yard. Informal garden with potted plants and flowing bushes.
