THE EASTER SEASON: The Easter season is celebrated during the seven weeks between Easter and Pentecost. Called "the Great Sunday" by Saint Athanasius, these fifty days of Easter are celebrated as one great Feast Day. These days, above all others, are the days for the singing of the Alleluia and so, throughout the entire Easter season, Christians sing the triumphant "Alleluia" as they continue to rejoice in the hope of the resurrection.

Sunday's Theme

oday's Gospel reading should resonate well with us as we glimpse the early Christian community's uncertainty about its future. As the disciples try to come to terms with the fact that Jesus is about to leave them, they grow troubled and afraid, not knowing how they will survive without him. Jesus assures them that he will send "the Advocate, the



Holy Spirit" who will teach them and remind them of all that Jesus has told them. When we face difficulties within the Church, Jesus assures us too that the Church can always rely on the Spirit to guide and direct in troubled times. We must not forget this. Trusting in the Spirit, we will discover the peace that Jesus gives - a peace the world does not know.

MAY 22 - NATIONAL COLLECTION FOR THE POPE'S PASTORAL **WORKS:** When a disastrous flood or earthquake strikes a nation in some part of the world, many countries rush in food, medicine, blankets, and money. Prominent among such aid is the financial help offered by the Holy Father to people in need. In the name of Catholics everywhere, the Pope displays Christ's love and compassion for those who suffer. Canada has been consistent in giving such funds to the Holy See, enabling the Holy Father to be even more generous in times of disaster. Each year at this time, Canadian Catholics are asked to give generously to the papal collection entitled "The Pope's Pastoral Works" to assist those stricken by natural disasters.



MAY 23 - VICTORIA DAY: This year Victoria Day is celebrated on Monday, May 23. The birthday (May 24, 1819) of Queen Victoria has been celebrated as a holiday in Canada West (now Ontario) since 1845; it became a national holiday in 1901, the year that Queen Victoria died. Although the Sovereign changed along the years, the day of her/his birthday celebration remained. In 1952, it was established on the Monday preceding May 25. Today it is appropriate to offer prayers for the Queen, for Canada, and for justice and peace in the world.

May 27 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT AUGUSTINE OF CANTERBURY, BISHOP: In 596, Augustine and about 40 monks were sent by Pope Gregory the Great to evangelize England where they were well received. Augustine was soon made Bishop and was instructed to develop a hierarchy for England and to substitute Christian feasts for pagan celebrations. He established a Benedictine monastery at Canterbury. Augustine became the first Archbishop of Canterbury and was known as the "Apostle of the English". He continued to work for the faith in Britain until his death in 604.
