## Hints for Taking Calendar Photos

The Calendar Committee greatly appreciates the effort put forth by each member who takes and submits photos for the calendar. Here are a few tips to help you have your photos selected for publication.

- Remove distractions such as garden flags.
- Don't let white flowers make your photo overexposed.
- Use a steady hand for a well focused photo. Vertical photos do not take up the whole page, horizontal are best.



Realizing they are not as easy to take as individual flowers, photos of your garden are greatly appreciated. Your chances of having your photo used are greater if you take a spring,

fall, or winter shot. There are three winter months, two fall months minimum, and two spring months minimum. That's seven months needing season appropriate photos. Usually the majority of photos that come in can only be used for summer months, a maximum of five months.

The Committee also wants to encourage everyone to patronize our sponsors when shopping. Tell them you appreciate their support of our calendar project and use the coupons. The sponsors contributions to the project ensures it is a profitable one for GGC.

## The Monarch Butterfly Release At Winnie Palmer Nature Reserve



August 12 was a perfect Saturday at the Winnie Palmer Nature Reserve. Perfect too to release 250 Monarch butterflies. The gardens there are lovely and those who wished were treated to guided tours by WPNR staff and volunteers.

Approximately 600 people enjoyed two presentations by "Butterfly Guy" Rick Mikula. Always entertaining, Rick presented two separate programs, both filled to capacity. Children and adults learned about the life cycle of butterflies and the migration of the Monarchs. After each release, he autographed his popular, educational books purchased by the eager crowd: "The Family Butterfly Book" and "Butterflies of the World" Fandex.

Many, many thanks to Winnie Palmer Nature Reserve for sponsoring the Butterfly Release. In addition to the entire facility, they invited vendors who sold refreshments, scones, jewelry, plants, and offered FREE photographs.

WPNR and GGC volunteers offered free children's crafts and face painting. GGC sold butterfly novelties, flower wands and PBJ sandwiches. WPNR displayed aquariums with Monarch caterpillar larva for all to see this different stage of the Monarch.

Many thanks to all the volunteers of GGC and the staff and volunteers of WPNR for the hard work and effort put forth to make this event a HUGE success!
