


FORT LEE TOUR OFFERS UNIQUE OPPORTUNITIES! FEBRUARY 20, 2020

PEARL HARBOR REMEMBRANCE DAY 2019

Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day Ceremony was held on 7 December 2019 at the Virginia War Memorial, led by Richmond Council Navy League. Our speaker was CAPT Brian Finman, Commodore of Amphibious Squadron Four. CAPT Finman has been a good friend of our Council, beginning with his days as XO of USS CARTER HALL, then heading our October 2019 Sea Services Luncheon, and then in December being our keynote speaker. Other participants included Pearl Harbor Survivor Leonard Gardner, the

Varina NJROTC Color Guard, wreath bearers representing several organizations, a bagpiper, a soloist, uniformed Navy personnel from NOSC tolling the ship's bell and saluting, the Marine Corps League Rifle Honor Guard and buglers playing Taps. This annual Remembrance Day honors those Virginians who gave their lives for us at Pearl Harbor. Lest they Be Forgotten.

RICHMOND COUNCIL VISITS NAVAL SURFACE WARFARE CENTER AT DAHLGREN

A near-busload of Navy Leaguers and guests spent an interesting day at Dahlgren on November 15, 2019. The group was escorted by an outgoing and knowledgeable docent on what Dahlgren refers to as their "Centennial Tour". This tour provides an overview of the numerous and varied programs and projects ongoing at the base.

Greetings from USS GRAVELY!

Having completed operational tasking for 2019, we shifted focus this month towards preparing for our maintenance period and entering dry dock. The first three weeks were filled with pre-dry dock meetings, equipment offloads, and de-fueling the ship's four-hundred thousand gallons

of fuel. The crew also devoted a great deal of effort in preparing for inspections with the Afloat Training Group (ATG) and our Immediate Superior in Charge (ISIC), Destroyer Squadron (DESRON) Two Eight. ATG inspected GRAVELY's anti-terrorism / force protection capabilities, as well as a few other warfare areas, and found our programs to be in great shape. Similarly, DESRON Two Eight evaluated GRAVELY's administrative programs, such as our personnel management and personnel security programs. We were able to perform well and received very favorable scores. We concluded the month with an eighteen hour move to dry dock in the NASSCO shipyard. With dry air beneath the keel and most of the ship's habitability equipment turned off, the crew moved from our shipboard living quarters to temporary berthing's onboard a barge. Two days later, the Captain celebrated Thanksgiving with shipmates and family, serving a delicious holiday feast prepared by GRAVELY's Culinary Specialist onboard the berthing barge. As the month comes to an end, the crew works hard to prepare for a successful start to our maintenance phase.
