

Pesach 2021 Another Zoom Seder?

The arrival of Pesach this month reminds us that our lives have been out of kilter now for over a year. It was last year's reluctant acknowledgement that we would not be sharing our Seders in person that finally convinced us that our lives were taking an unexpected turn. Some of us opted for setting aside the customary practice for the year. Others of us were driven to creativity: the first generation of Jews to celebrate Pesach online. This year finds us veterans. We have been through this before and we respond to the new reality as if it were a matter of course: "OK it's time to start making plans for the zoom seder". If nothing else, the year has shown us just how resilient and adaptable we can be.

And, in a way that is what Pesach itself teaches us. Even in the most routine of times, we set aside our routine to change our dishes and change our diets, and try something radically new, even if only for seven days. And our distant ancestors, who fled Egypt? Wasn't theirs the story of leaving the known and familiar behind and venturing into the unknown and challenging? We adapt. We are confronted with new and difficult circumstances and we find a way to make it viable.

And, yes, we are entitled to celebrate ourselves. We have discovered that we are more flexible than we might have feared. We have endured a hard, and perhaps painful, year. And we have made it through. We look forward to the passing of winter and the arrival of spring. We look forward to the end of this ordeal—the time when we and our dear ones and most of our fellow citizens receive their vaccinations and we can begin to make our way, slowly and tentatively, back toward life as it has been familiar to us.

We open the door for Elijah. We open doors back to living our lives more fully. Sheltering in place though we are, may your Pesach be meaningful and joyous.

As a congregation, you also had a part - being role models, with these students watching you participate in services and Jewish events. 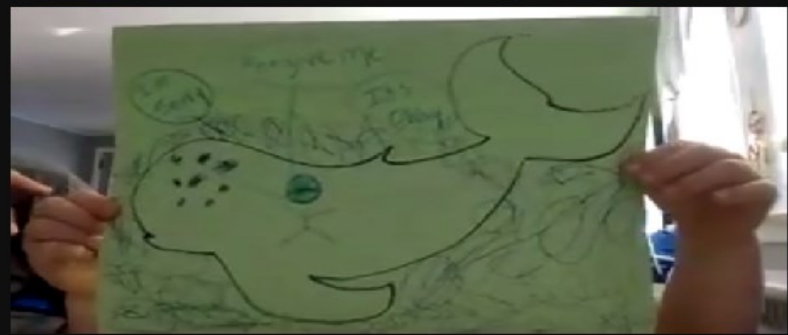
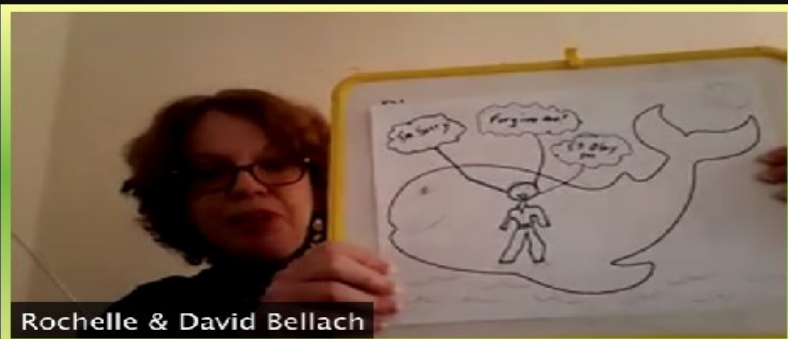
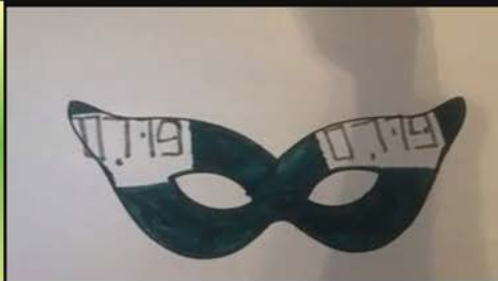

Israeli Salad



Ingredients:

- 3-4 Roma Tomatoes
- 1 Large English or Persian Seedless Cucumber
- 1 Red Pepper (optional)
- 1/2 Onion—red or yellow
- 1/2 cup parsley
- 3 Tbsp Olive Oil
- 1/8 cup of lemon juice freshly squeezed
- Sea Salt to taste
- Pepper (optional) to taste

Directions:

- Finely dicing the tomatoes, cucumber, peppers, onions, and parsley.
- Once you've chopped all of the chopped vegetables add them to a large bowl (not a small bowl, this is a decent amount of salad and you want to be able to mix without spilling) with the chopped parsley.
- Drizzle with the olive oil and lemon, then salt to taste, viola – that's it!


