THE "REAL PRESENCE"

(Ex. 24:3-8; Ps. 116: 12-13, 15-18; Heb. 9:11-15; Mark 14: 12-16, 22-26)

"Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats My flesh and drinks My blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For My flesh is true food, and My blood is true drink" (John 653-55).

This Sunday is the Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time of the Liturgical Year B. But, being the Second Sunday after Pentecost, we are celebrating the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. The feast, of which origin is traced back to the twelfth century, was given prominence by St. Juliana of Liege, Belgium, an Augustinian nun, who had a great and pious devotion to the Body and Blood of Christ. She had absolute faith that the bread and wine presented at Mass, at the moment of consecration, becomes the Real Presence of Jesus Christ. She had great devotion to the Eucharist because Jesus at the Last Supper, took the bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to His disciples saying, "This is My body, which will be given for you, do this in memory of Me...This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which will be shed for you" (Luke 22: 19-20).

In today's feast, you and I celebrate the real, but mysterious presence of the Lord Jesus Christ with the community. We celebrate God's initiative in His love to live among His people and thus satisfy their insatiable hunger for love, peace and justice. In the feast of Corpus Christi, we celebrate the mystery of the selfgiving love of Christ for you and me. In this mystery, Christ gives Himself to us in the semblance of bread and wine. Today's first reading tells us of the covenant Moses established between God and the children of Israel, how the latter assented to "do everything that the Lord has told us;" and how Moses sprinkled the blood of sacrifice on the people and said to them, "This is the blood of the covenant that the Lord has made with you..." In this Old Testament passage, the blood of senseless and irrational beasts had therefore, become a symbolism of God's redemptive love - for cleansing and the redemption of His chosen people.

In the new dispensation, you and I are the people that God created in God's own image and likeness. He did not create us in the image of an irrational animal or in any other image, but in His own image; thus, in giving His Body and Blood to us, He intends that vou and I will be saved by Him and Him alone, because "Whoever eats My flesh and drinks My blood has eternal life." Therefore, the Eucharist, Body and Blood of Christ, is a fulfillment of the covenant the Lord has made with us - a covenant of love and redemption. It is a sacrament of God's love for us on our pilgrimage to Heaven. Christ, the High Priest, offers Himself as the eternal covenant between God and us. For us Catholics, our faith tells us that the Body and Blood of Christ is a viaticum (food for the journey) for you and me. It is the Food for our journey here on earth. It is a sacrament of a God Who will not leave us alone along the way, but is right beside us always.

Todav's feast calls our attention to the gift Jesus gave us in His Body and Blood (the Eucharist). It calls on all of us to recapture the fire of our faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Our true faith should be seen in our attitude and reverence toward Jesus Who is present in the Tabernacle and on the Altar at every Mass and whenever we are in church.

ANTHONY OF PADUA Priest and Doctor (1195-1231)



The gospel call to leave everything and follow Christ was the rule of Anthony's life. Over and over again God called him to something new in His plan. Every time Anthony responded with renewed zeal and self-sacrificing to serve his Lord Jesus more completely.

His journey as the servant of God began as a very young man when he decided to join the Augustinians, giving up a future of wealth and power to be a servant of God. Later when the bodies of the first Franciscan

martyrs went through the Portuguese city where he was stationed, he was again filled with an intense longing to be one of those closest to Jesus himself: those who die for the Good News.

So Anthony entered the Franciscan Order and set out to preach to the Moors. But an illness prevented him from achieving that goal. He went to Italy and was stationed in a small hermitage where he spent most of his time praying, reading the Scriptures and doing menial tasks.

The call of God came again at an ordination where no one was prepared to speak. The humble and obedient Anthony hesitantly accepted the task. The years of searching for Jesus in prayer, of reading sacred Scripture and of serving Him in poverty, chastity and obedience had prepared Anthony to allow the Spirit to use his talents. Anthony's sermon was astounding to those who expected an unprepared speech and knew not the Spirit's power to give people words.

Recognized as a great man of prayer and a great Scripture and theology scholar, Anthony became the first friar to teach theology to the other friars. Soon he was called from that post to preach to the heretics, to use his profound knowledge of Scripture and theology to convert and reassure those who had been misled.

COMMENT: Anthony should be the patron of those who find their lives completely uprooted and set in a new and unexpected direction. Like all saints, he is a perfect example of turning one's life completely over to Christ. God did with Anthony as God pleased - and what God pleased was a life of spiritual power and brilliance that still attracts admiration today. He whom popular devotion has nominated as finder of lost objects found himself by losing himself totally to the providence of God.
