Shooters Corner:

What's new at ECSC: The board meets at the clubhouse on the 3rd Tuesday of every month with meetings now starting at 6:30. Club members are urged to attend. Current 2015 membership now stands at 612. Areas of discussion at the March board meeting centered on the upcoming controlled burn, club insurance review, grounds machinery upkeep, and the possibility of hosting a Wounded Warrior event.



Future projects: It was announced on that the Friends of the NRA has awarded a \$5,000 grant application to help the ECSC with the refurbishing of the first of our two existing trap ranges. Plans for the west trap field are to replace all the cement walkways with 3 foot wide tracks to accommodate all shooters including those who are handicapped and to replace the old trap machine with a machine capable of throwing single and possibly double trap. The board members are hoping that it will start seeing more of our trap shooters start showing up to use the trap fields. There is speculation on the possibility of a summer and fall trap league starting up. More news on that subject as it becomes available.

There will be a controlled burn of the ECSC woods this spring to help return the forest to its' original natural setting. This burn will eliminate a large majority of the evasive plant species that are starting to take over the woods. A good example of this is the Honeysuckle brush which has really taken a strong foothold in the woods. This burn will help eradicate the majority of this insidious specie and open up the woods to a more <u>natural growth</u>. The burn will be under the control of the Illinois Nature Preserves Commission (Bob Edgin) and the Effingham Water Authority. No exact date of this project has been set. The INPC will determine the burn day depending on ground cover moisture, wind speed, and wind direction. Note**** 3D Bow Benders archery shooters, please contact Bob Allen (217) 821-1212 a few days before your next shoot. The woods will not be useable for activities for a week or so after the burn.

*FNRA: The 2015 Annual Friends of the NRA banquet was held on Thursday March 5 with a turnout of almost 500 attendees. A ton of money was raised (\$45,000+) and over 50 firearms were won or auctioned off. A big thanks goes out to all of those who attended and supported this non-profit arm of the NRA.



*CMP/NRA High Power: NRA approved Highpower Rifle Matches at the Club are shot at 200 yards from the standing, sitting and prone positions. Full course matches are shot at 200, 300 and 600 yards, but since we do not have pits and moveable target frames, we use official targets that are reduced for 200 yards that simulate 300 and 600 yards. This is accomplished by reducing the size of the scoring rings to compensate for distance and the effect of wind. The overriding factor for shooting at a maximum of 200 yds at our range is the inability to seeing bullet holes in the targets in typical range conditions. These "reduced" targets are completely legal and count towards NRA Highpower Rifle classification just as a full course match would. Our type of matches are often referred to as "walk and paste" matches, since the shooter walks from the firing line to the target after each stage of the match to score, repair and/or replace the paper target.

The course of fire is as follows:

- 1. 5 minute Sighter stage any safe position may be used, no scoring, used to confirm your sight settings prior to firing shots for record.
- 2. Standing, slow fire 20 shots, loaded singly, in a maximum time limit of 20 minutes. The only position a sling cannot be used for support.
- 3. Sitting, rapid fire 2 strings of 10 shots each in 60 seconds, 20 shots total, includes a mandatory magazine or clip change. 2 minute prep period between strings.
- 4. Prone, rapid fire -2 strings of 10 shots each in 70 seconds, 20 shots total, includes a mandatory magazine or clip change. 2 minute prep period between strings.
- 5. Prone, slow fire -20 shots, loaded singly, in a maximum time limit of 20 minutes.

Each stage is preceded by a 3 minute non-firing Preparation Period, in which you can handle your rifle, but not your ammunition. This period is used to establish your position and ready your equipment for the upcoming stage. There are a total of 80 shots for record, with a maximum possible score of 800 for the match.

The equipment you will need includes, but is not limited to:

- 1. Most importantly a safe attitude and a desire to learn.
- 2. A safe rifle capable of holding at least 5 rounds, iron sights or optics, centerfire, max .35 cal.
- 3. 90 rounds of safe, good quality ammunition for your rifle.
- 4. A tarp, pad or shooting mat, we shoot on the grass in front of the covered firing line.
- 5. Hearing and eye protection.
- 6. Spotting scope or binoculars to see bullet holes in target.
- 7. Minimum 2 magazines or clips, or stripper clips, for rapid fire stages.

If you lack anything but #1, we can help. The Club has loaner rifles available for use, ammo at nominal cost, and plenty of shooters that are glad to lend you equipment for the match. And we have mentors assigned to new shooters to help guide them through the match. Safety is our top priority, followed by having fun, and scores are a distant third. As with trying any new shooting sport, the hardest part is setting aside any preconceived notions, swallowing your pride, and taking the first shot. From that shot on, the fun and challenge grow exponentially! Give it a try, you won't be sorry!
