# THE EIGHT TEAM PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff has been around for just four seasons (2014-2017) and while it's a huge improvement from the BCS, it still has flaws. With five Power 5 leagues and just 4 slots, it just doesn't make sense to leave out the champion of a Power 5 league each and every season. I have been and will continue to make it clear that I would like to see an 8-team playoff format. I would have the quarter-finals played at the home stadiums of the four highest seeds. The winners would move on to the way it's set-up now and those 4 losing teams would play in traditional bowl games.

Below I show how the teams might have been seeded and who would have played who and where had there been an 8-team playoff since 2010. Obviously I'm guessing who the 3 at-large teams would have been and how the teams would have been seeded. Are there flaws with these 8 brackets? Yes. Too many at-large teams from the Big Ten and SEC and a couple of late season conference rematches in the quarter-final games. However, most of these games would have been intriguing to watch.

Why do I have quarter-final games being played on-campus? The fact that the fans are already having to travel to two neutral sites if they make it to the National Championship Game means that allowing the best seeds to host those quarter-final games would result in teams not being able to afford to "rest" in any game down the stretch, thus preserving the importance of every game not to mention, easing the bank accounts of the fans who want to watch their teams play in the post-season in person.

Look, I know that there are many who don't believe that a mediocre champion should take up a spot in an 8-team playoff. I say, more often than not the champion of a Power 5 League is deserving and if by chance that conference champion backed into a conference championship, then so be it. It would not be the end-of-the-world.

We took the final BCS Rankings (2010-2013) and the final CFP Ranking (2014-2017) to come up with the teams and seedings.

We have already seen too many deserving conference champions without an opportunity to compete for the National Championship because the selection committee "thinks" they selected the 4 best teams. We'll never know for sure if a team that was left out in 2014, 2015, 2016 or 2017 might have eventually won the national championship.



# BOWL GAMES BETWEEN ASSOCIATED PRESS TOP 10 TEAMS

On the next 0 pages is a list of every bowl game between Associated Press Top 10 ranked teams since the AP began ranking teams in 1936. In the history of college football there have been 218 bowl games in which both programs were ranked in the Associated Press top 10 prior to the kickoff of the bowl game. We have listed each of those 218 games in this issue. We list, by conference, the won-loss records of each school. We also list every school with at least 7 victories in these great bowl match-ups. One point of interest is that 3 of these Top 10 bowl match-ups ended in a tie and they are listed.

We list the date the bowl was played, the bowl game, the teams along with their pre-bowl rankings, their pre-game won-loss records and the final score. We also list their conference affiliation at the time the game was played, the venue where the bowl game was played, the attendance of the bowl game and the TV network.
