We are now Hernando County Fire Rescue Station number 6.

This past spring Steve Krou, Chairman of our GAC Vision Committee, approached the new Fire Chief and asked if he could paint our fire hydrants as local marine life. The chief said that they preferred them to remain painted in regulation colors but could he paint something "beachy" on the Fire House door. Steve ran with the idea and it morphed into murals on all 4 fire house doors. Steve reached out to the community and garnered the support of the community and our local artists. Steve, Diane Liptak, and Dan Garrett volunteered the artistic skills and time. Working with the firemen the group came up with mural ideas for the doors.

They started with the first door sketching out their design on the door over a base coat, they then started work on filling in the large areas of background color working down over many, many days to painting in the fine details.

The first door celebrates our Gulf sunset looking out over the Gulf from a beach chair. The second door design is a storm showing lightening striking over the Weeki Wachee Preserve and the start of the fire in the preserve from that lightning strike. Our third door is of the sunrise over the Weeki Wachee Preserve with a Bald Eagle front and center catching a fish in its claws. The fourth door was their most ambitious design so far. It is a marine life celebration highlighting all the sea life that we see in our Gulf waters off Hernando Beach. The center piece of the design is a beautiful mermaid reaching out to the sea life around her. The detail of the mermaid, fish, shellfish, plants, corals, manatees and more is amazing and just gorgeous.

LICENSE-FREE SALTWATER FISHING DAY SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 2, 2017, 12:01AM - 11:59PM

Free fishing days provide an excellent opportunity for parents who don't yet have licenses to take youth fishing, or avid anglers to introduce a friend to fishing without having to purchase a license. On these days, the fishing license requirement is waived for all recreational anglers (residents and non-residents). All other rules (e.g., seasons, bag and size limits) apply. The saltwater waiver applies to any recreational harvest requiring a saltwater fishing license (e.g., crabbing, lobstering, scalloping, etc.) as well as fishing from shore or a boat. A snook or spiny lobster permit are not required on these days.



Nature Photographers can experience a wide variety of wildlife as well as bring a new photographic inspiration.

During this photography hike we will experiment with a photographic technique called panning. This technique can help you bring out a new creative way of photographing nature.

Sept 7 | Thursday | Day One: We will be learning about the history of Withlacoochee Forest, the eco -system and how important conservation is to these areas. Photographer Alice Mary Herden will review camera settings and the environment we will be photographing. We also will be previewing



a technique called panning and learning some quick Photoshop

Workshop is 3 hours from 8 am to 11am at Chinsegut Conservation Center 23212 Lake Lindsey Road Brooksville, Florida.

Afterwards...Take a nice hike along the Nature Center Tract and detour to the Cypress Walk to get an amazing view of May's Prairie or hang out at the Bird & Butterfly Garden to photograph a wide variety of birds from Cardinals to Chickadees.

Sept 8 | Friday | Day Two: Meeting up for the Hike. Our hike will consist of three specific locations to Smiths Prairie. Our first designation we will follow a trail through scenic pine trees and photograph an array of plant life and wildflowers. At this stop we will learn a photography technique called panning. The crossroads is our next stop where the red-cockaded woodpecker may make an appearance to be photographed. The Redcockaded woodpecker has been a federally protected endangered species since 1970 and is federally listed as endangered in Florida and capturing a photo of one of these birds would be fantas-

tic... however there are many other beautiful birds to photograph. Our final hiking destination leads to Smiths Prairie. This non-stop hike is around 15-20 minutes.

Photography hike begins at 9 AM and run until 12 PM. Please arrive by 8:45 AM to check in for hike. Those that register will receive an email with directions to the meet-up location.

Your registration fee includes any single daily permits required at some locations.

AlertHernando Emergency Notification System makes its debut

Hernando County has launched its new emergency notification system, AlertHernando, which informs residents to emergency situations so that they can act to protect themselves.

Through AlertHernando, the County can contact thousands of residents within minutes with important information such as severe weather, unexpected road closures, missing persons and evacuations of buildings or neighborhoods. Residents are encouraged to register now for this free service. Signing up is quick, easy and secure on the AlertHernando website at <u>www.AlertHernando.org</u>.

"We know that communication is the key to ensuring the safety of our residents, and we are always looking for ways to improve that process," said Cecilia Patella, Hernando County Emergency Management Director. "With the implementation of AlertHernando, residents will receive timely automated emergency weather alerts to help them respond more quickly to each unique situation. With the height of hurricane season rapidly approaching, I want to encourage all

Residents listed in the Yellow or White Pages will be automatically subscribed to alerts by phone. AlertHernando registration also allows residents and visitors to self-register and provide additional contact information.

AlertHernando is powered by Everbridge, a global enterprise software company that provides applications which automate the delivery of critical information to help keep people safe and businesses running, and is the service provider for the development and implementation of AlertFlorida under the Florida Division of Emergency Management. This service is provided at no charge to all Florida counties. Funding was made possible by the Florida Legislature from the Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund.


