For the past few weeks I have had 'mission' on my brain. I knew that Mars UP would close on twenty twenty-three in a strong way and would be set up well at the start of this year. With the parking lot project completed the church has an opportunity to set her eyes on new goals and for me that goal is mission. The church has done exceptional mission the past several years, with missional giving going up every year, but somehow I know we can do more. With the full weight and power of Mars UP behind it, there is no telling how much mission this church can do in the coming year! The dreaming and thought of the missional work this body of Christ is capable of has been filling me with excitement these past few weeks. But today I hit a snag. What mission should we do? What should be our focus in 2024? Should it be on the sick? The elderly? The impoverished? The outcast? The stranger? The addicted? Where should our focus be as it pertains to mission for this new year?

I didn't have an answer to that question and what's more, I'm not sure it's my question to answer. Never the less I set out to try and answer it. Our Church Mission statement as found on our website is good and thought provoking, but did not provide me with the clear answer as to what our missional focus should be on. So like any good pastor I turned to the scriptures to try to find some guidance as to what our church's missional focus should be this year. Did you know that the word mission does not appear in the bible! If we define mission as 'an important task we are sent to do' then the scriptures have a lot to say about that, but to narrow all of the possibilities down to one focus is a mindblowing task. Should we focus on feeding the hungry or on clothing the naked? Should we focus on those in prison or those in hospitals? Should we focus on our neighbors next door or our sisters and brothers across the world? There are too many options, and all of a sudden my desire to make this year about mission was beginning to wane.

This is when I turned to an unlikely source of wisdom. I looked to see what the Book of Order (The constitution for the Presbyterian Church USA) said about the mission of the church. And wouldn't you know it: Chapter One of the Book of Order is titled "The Mission of the Church". The first paragraphs come under the heading "God's Mission". In this section I found these words:

"In Christ, the Church participates in God's mission for the transformation of creation and humanity by proclaiming to all people the good news of God's love, offering to all people the grace of God at font and table, and calling all people to discipleship in Christ."

And it hit me! I was focused on the ways we carry out mission not on the mission itself. The mission, our mission as the church, hasn't changed. Participate in the transformation of the world by proclaiming the Good News of God's love, offer grace, and invite all people into discipleship in Christ. That's the mission!

Friends, whether we do this by donating food to the food pantry, or sending kids to camp, or providing funds so that refugees can have a roof over their head, or pack clean-up buckets for the next disaster, or some combination of all of those; we do those things to share God's love and to make disciples! That is our focus this year! This is what we are going to do! Over the remaining weeks and months of this year, you will hear me pushing the need to expand our missional outreach. What that specifically looks like I do not know, but I do know that we have a lot of love to share, and some really good news to tell, and people from all stripes to make disciples. I hope you will join me in this mission, the mission of the church, to preach the gospel (Mark 16:15) and make disciples (Matthew 28:16 -20).

Per Capita—What is it & Why Do it???

Many have asked questions about per capita, What is it? What does it support?

The Per Capita is an important aspect of how we do church. Presbyterians are proud of how our convictions inform our church function and organizational structure. As Presbyterians, we believe in "the priesthood of all believers" and acknowledge that all are called to bring their gifts and talents to God (1 Peter 2:9). And so, we champion this idea "call" throughout all levels of our denomination. On the local church level, church members are called to serve as Elders, Deacons, and pastors. Elders and pastors of churches in geographical groupings gather as Presbyteries.

There will be a Per Capita envelope in February's envelope mailing. <u>The cost per member is \$44.20</u> In a small but significant way, consider Per Capita as one way YOU and MARS UP CHURCH might be able to respond along with other Christians and churches across the nation, proclaiming the Gospel message that sin, separation and disunity will not have the final answer for us, our church, our denomination OR our world. The final answer is fully in the sovereign hands of God. Indeed, God is greater and more powerful than our broken and foolish ways of sin.

This is Jesus' prayer and petition for us: "I have told you (plural) these things, so that in me you (plural) may have peace. In this world you (plural) will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world" (John 16:33).
