#### **CURRENT & NEW SERMON SERIES**

On Sunday, April 23, we began a new and relatively short walk- 4 Sundays- through the post-resurrection (that is to say AFTER Easter) appearances of Jesus called <u>Closing Night Strike</u>. We won't talk about ALL of His appearances, but we will get an overview of what happened after Easter morning and before Jesus ascended into Heaven. Each week will have a song tied to it – in fact it's the name of the message – that is related to the story we'll look at that week. The remaining weeks of the series look like this:

Sunday, May 7- I Can't Fight This Feeling Any More (John 21:15-22)

There comes a point when surrender is the only option.

(Psalm 73:24-26, Matthew 22:37-40)

Sunday, May 14- Don't Stop Believing (Matthew 28:16-20)

Jesus (and Mom) gives us guidelines on how to live life.

(John 12:24-26, John 20:19-23)

And then, on Sunday, May 21, we start another brief yet exciting journey! A few weeks ago, I had a conversation with a parishioner that led to this question from them, "Would you consider preaching about how to be a "good" Christian WITHOUT being a doormat?" And it struck me- THAT is a profound concept! And this new, brief sermon series grew out of that! Through **Doormat Theology**, we will spend two weeks (including Memorial Day Sunday, when we remember those who have passed) focusing on that very question. The two weeks of the series look like this:

**Sunday, May 21- You're Not Alone** (Psalm 8)

If someone else is devaluing you, there's a good chance you are, too! (Psalm 13:1-2, Ephesians 1:3-4)

Sunday, May 28 (Memorial Day weekend) - Raise Expectations (Psalm 121)

Your response to someone else's behavior teaches them what is and isn't acceptable. (Isaiah 55:3a, Luke 6:37-38)

Come each week expecting God to show up in powerful ways!



We will also remember those in our church, our families and our community who have died. Names of loved ones who have died in the past year will be read and a bell will be tolled. Also, each family in attendance will have the opportunity to come forward and light a candle in memory of a loved one that they have lost.
