### *Mary's Humility*

O Mary, humblest of all creatures, make me humble of heart. St. Bernard says: *"It is not hard to be humble in a hidden life, but to remain so in the midst of honors is a truly rare and beautiful virtue."* The Blessed Virgin was certainly the woman whom God honored most highly, whom He raised above all other creatures; yet no creature was so humble and lowly as she. A holy rivalry seemed to exist between Mary and God; the higher God elevated her, the lowlier she became in her humility. The Angel called her "full of grace," and Mary "was troubled" (Luke 1:28, 29). According to St. Alphonsus' explanation, *"Mary was troubled because she was filled with humility, disliked praise, and desired that God only be praised."* The Angel revealed to her the sublime mission which was to be entrusted to her by the Most High, and Mary declared herself "the handmaid of the Lord" (Luke 1:38). Her thoughts did not linger over the immense honor that would be hers as the woman chosen from all women to be the Mother of the Son of God; but, she contemplated in wonder the great mystery of a God who willed to become incarnate in the womb of a poor creature. If God wished to descend so far as to give Himself to her as a Son, to what depths should not His little handmaid abase herself? The more she understood the grandeur of the mystery, the immensity of the divine gift, the more she humbled herself, submerging herself in her nothingness. Her attitude was the same when Elizabeth greeted her, *"Blessed art thou among women"* (Luke 1:42). Those words did not astonish her, for she was already the Mother of God; yet she remained steadfast in her profound humility. She attributed everything to God whose mercies she sang, acknowledging the condescension with which He had *"regarded the humility of His handmaid"* (Luke 1:48). That

God had performed great works in her she knew and acknowledged, but instead of boasting about them, she directed everything to His glory. Behold the effect that graces and divine favors should produce in us: an increase of humility, a greater awareness of our nothingness.

*"O Virgin! Glorious Stem, to what sublime height do you raise your corolla? Straight to Him who is seated on the throne, to the God of Majesty. I do not wonder since you are so deeply rooted in humility. Hail, Mary, full of grace! You are truly full of grace, for you are pleasing to God, to the angels, and to men: to men, by your maternity; to the angels, by your virginity; to God, by your humility. - St. Bernard*

### *La Humildad de María*

Oh María, la más humilde de todas las creaturas, hazme de Corazón humilde. San Bernardo dice: "No es duro ser humilde en una vida escondida, pero permanecer así en medio de honores es verdad una verdadera y hermosa virtud." La Santísima Virgen fue ciertamente la mujer que Dios más honro, y a quien el edificio sobre todas las creaturas; sin embargo, ninguna otra creatura ha sido tan humilde como ella. Una santa rivalidad parece existir entre María y Dios; Entre mas Dios la elevaba, ella se volvía más humilde. El Ángel la llamo "llena de gracia," y María "se turbo" (Lucas 1:28,29). De acuerdo a la explicación de San Alfonso, "María se turbo porque ella estaba llena de humildad, le desagradaban los elogios, y deseaba que solo a Dios se le alabara." El Ángel le revelo a ella la sublime misión que le había confiado el Altísimo, y María se declaró, ella misma, "la sierva del Señor" (Lucas 1:38). Sus pensamientos no disminuyeron por el inmenso honor que le pertenecía por ser la mujer escogida entre todas las mujeres para ser la Madre del Hijo de Dios; pero, ella contemplaba con gran asombro el gran misterio de un Dios que quería ser encarnado en el vientre de una pobre creatura. Si Dios quería rebajarse a tal grado de darse el mismo para ser su Hijo, a que profundidad no se rebajaría ella misma? Entre más ella entendía lo grande del misterio, la inmensidad del regalo divino, más ella se hacía humilde, sumergiéndose en su poca cosa. Su actitud era la misma que cuando Isabel la saludo, "Bendita eres entre todas las mujeres" (Lucas 1:42). Estas palabras no la asombraron pues ella ya era la Madre de Dios; sin embargo, ella permaneció puesta en su profunda humildad. Ella le atribuía todo a Dios del cual ella cantaba su misericordia, reconociendo la condescendencia que él tenía "en relación a la humildad de su sierva" (Lucas 1:48). Dios había hecho grandes obras en ella y ella lo sabía y lo reconocía, pero en vez de engrandecerse debido a ellas, ella dirigió todo hacia Su gloria. He aquí el efecto que la gracia y los favores divinos deben producir en nosotros: un aumento de humildad, un mayor reconocimiento de nuestra nada.

*"¡Oh Virgen! ¿Glorioso tronco, hasta que altura llega tu corola? Derechito a El que está sentado en el trono, al Dios de Majestad. Yo no me asombro puesto que estas tan hondamente enraizadas en la humildad. ¡Dios te salve María, llena eres de gracia! Tu realmente estas llena de gracia, pues eres agradable a Dios, a los ángeles, y a los hombres: a los hombres, por tu maternidad; a los ángeles por tu virginidad; a Dios por tu humildad. –San Bernardo*
