

Sept 7, 2021

Meeting started at 7:15

Members present: John Meidema, Jacob Tow, Clint Cook, Luke Eising Donald Maxson, Rachel Belcher.

Old Business: Discussion at the prompting of Robert Birr and John Tow to review the ordinances on junk vehicles mostly pointed at autos and rvs.

The discussion led to the review and that a minor adjustment of the regulations being sufficient with the addition that the vehicles must be screened from view from adjoining properties and roadways as an avenue of compliance.

New business focused around reviewing the green belt section of the ordinance with the point of making it clearer as to its application however the board agreed that no adjustment was necessary.

We then moved on to a discussion about the ordinances regarding the growth of marijuana as a business or home occupation that we currently have on the books. We came to the agreement that removing this section of the ordinance would be best and to put in a statement reasoning the idea that the vast majority of voters resoundingly rejected the legalization of recreational marijuana. Therefore, with this information in the forefront of our decision process we are removing all avenues (subject to the governance of state statutes) of production of marijuana other than for personal consumption (as per state statutes).

Moving into the next meeting we will be addressing the crafting of ordinances for the allowance of "small homes".

A motion was given from John Meidema and a second from Luke Eising to end the meeting and was passed.
