REACH of Cherokee and Graham

County, Inc. is an outreach program for victims of domestic violence.

As the staff travel to the schools to discuss domestic violence, they have identified a need for children's shoes, underwear, and socks of varying sizes. They have also adopted some families to help as well. If you have items of clothing (clean and in good condition), children's books, etc. to donate please place them in the blue bin located in the pantry. Check out the clearance section at Walmart next time you go shopping.

Stacy can always use some **small tote bags** and small travel size items to fill them with, e.g. travel size shampoo and conditioner, toothbrushes, tooth paste, travel size deodorant, hand sanitizer, etc. **Place items on the table located in the pantry on your left as you enter.**

Please contact the REACH office staff if you have furniture you want to donate to arrange pickup by the Thrift Store volunteers. They also ask for cooking utensils to help victims start over. Often the victims leave home with only the clothes on their back, so they are given clothes, furniture, and items for the home from the Thrift Store until they can get back on their feet. They also can use items to help with their self-esteem and pass the time until they can be placed in a safe environment. You can provide puzzles (500 pieces or less), adult coloring books, reading material, word puzzles, make -up, nail polish, hair clips, etc.

FOOD BANK DONATIONS

We need your help to keep our pantry stocked. If no family, or individual has made a special request; then, Lula pulls items off the shelves and takes them to the Cherokee County Food Bank, Inc. in Andrews, NC. The food bank is open to the public on Tuesdays and Saturdays from 10-12.

Suggested items based on Lula's previous discussion with some of the female staffs: they can always use feminine hygiene products and other personal hygiene items, e.g. toothpaste, toothbrushes, small bottles of mouthwash, bars of soap, wipes, small bottles of shampoo, soups that can be heated over a small fire, small jars of peanut butter and items that do not require a stove for cooking. Most of the clients are homeless and/or senior citizens living on a fixed income, so they can use small bottles of laundry detergent and Clorox to wash their clothes. **Lula also includes assorted chips and crackers to give to the homeless who sit outside next to the food bank.** The food bank has a bakery that donates bread, and the local Walmart provides fresh produce.

You can also write a check payable to the Andrews Food Bank, P. O. Box 843, Andrews, NC 28901, and they will supplement items that are not being donated.

To whom much is given, much will be required (Luke 12:48). If you have heard that line of wisdom, you know it means we are held responsible for what we have. If we have been blessed with talents, wealth, knowledge, time, and the like, it is expected that we benefit others.

Every WOMAN IN THE BIBLE

Every chapter in the book discuss both named and unnamed women of the Bible. The following entries indicate where the women are mentioned in the Bible, and where they are discussed in the Bible.

This week we continue with the letter S.

SARAI [SAY ri: “Yahweh is prince”]. Sarah’s original name. See Genesis 11:29; 16: 1-9.

SERAH [SEE rub: “extension”]. Mistranslated Sarah in some versions,

this daughter of Ashur is mentioned in Genesis 46: 17 and Numbers 26:46.

SHEERAH [SHEE uh ruh: “blood relationship”]. Spelled Sherah in some versions. This descendant of Ephraim is credited with founding three towns. See: I Chronicles 7:24.

SHELOMITH [shih LOE mith: “peaceful”]
 1. The mother of a blasphemer who was stoned to death around 1475 B.C. See Leviticus 24:11
 2. A daughter if Zerubbabel listed in the genealogy of the royal family after the return of the Jewish exiles to their homeland, about 500 B.C. See Ezra 8:10.

SHMEATH [SHIM ee ath: “fame”]. The Ammonite mother of one of the conspirators who murdered King Joash of Judah, around 825 B.C. See Kings 12:2].

SHIMRITH [SHIM rith: “watch”]. The Moabite mother of an official who helped murder King Joash of Judah, around 825 B.C. See 2 Chronicles 24: 26 and **SHOMER**.

SHIPRAH [SHIF ruh: “beauty”]. One of the midwives who won God’s favor by refusing to obey Pharaoh’s command to throw all Hebrew boys in the Nile, about 1525 B.B. See Exodus 1: 15-21.

SHOMER [SHOW muhr: “keeper” or “watcher”]. The mother of one of the men who conspired to murder King Joash of Judah, about 825 B.C. See 2 Kings 12: 21. She is mistakenly called Shimrith in 2 Chronicles 24:26.
