


Note from Father Jude

Families and the Gospel

Mk 8:27-35 If we want to be happy at home we must commit ("lose ourselves") to our family. If we try to be independent from others ("save ourselves") we end up lonely and alone. Happiness is found in commitments. The gospel is true: We save our life by losing it.

Liturgical Reflection

Although cremation is now permitted by the Church, it does not enjoy the same value as burial of the body. The Church clearly prefers and urges that the body of the deceased be present for the Funeral Mass, even when cremation follows. The presence of the human body better expresses the values which the Church affirms in the funerary rites. The body of Jesus was laid in the tomb and , on the third day, the Lord's body rose from the dead. When the Lord comes again in all his glory, our bodies will be reunited with our souls. Along with the usual bedtime ritual—a warm bath, teeth brushing and a story read aloud—one of the most important lessons parents or guardians can give their children at bedtime is the gift of prayer.

A Story of Faith, Hope & Charity.

The beginning of our Catholic faith is received in baptism and prayer is the beginning of a child's first image of God. Parents are the first to communicate faith to their children and are the primary educators reinforced by formal Catholic instruction available at parishes throughout the Diocese.

Educating youth about their faith is an important pillar of our Catholic mission. For public school students, religious education begins in kindergarten and continues through 11th grade. This year, more than 6,500 children and teens will receive age-appropriate lessons in faith, worship, morality, prayer, and service from 913 catechists (teachers), most of whom are volunteers.

"The parish's role through the pastor and catechist is to assist parents in fostering more of the Christian faith in their children," said Francine Swope, Director of Religious Education. "We hope that what a child learns in the classroom will be reinforced at home, by going to Mass, and participating in service projects that bring our faith to life. Parents, especially, play an important part in helping their child receive the Sacraments."

For many families today, the frantic pace of living sometimes outruns the importance of simply walking with Jesus. However, when faith is interwoven into kids' lives through family and community support and strengthened by additional parish supported education, lifelong Christian seeds are planted allowing them to enjoy the beauty of Christ, and hopefully become evangelizers of their own family.

Your support today of **Educating Youth (Religious Education)** will assist in the ongoing Catholic formation of children and teens as they continue their journey of seeking and trusting God into adulthood.
