- My initial thoughts...

 ❖ Flexible content is not a new concept
- * Flexible content is often misunderstood
- * Flexible content is currently used by few
- * Flexible content can be used by many

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Background Information

- * More formal flexible 30-hour EMT refresher attempted in the past (hybrid)
- Provider completes 24 hours of flexible content (online, conference, etc.)
- * Provider attends 6-hour "on-site" for testing and "hot topics"
- $\ \, \ \, \ \, \ \,$ Process proved inconclusive in effectiveness for cost/benefit

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Lessons Learned...

- $\boldsymbol{\diamond}$ Many providers still prefer traditional refresher training
- * Flexible EMS CE is effective with more direct oversight (validation)
- * Formal third-party assessment was cumbersome and ineffective
- ❖ Cost/benefit for third party assessment is significant

Why are we doing this now?

- ♦ Summer 2016 Wisconsin Legislative Council Committee was convened
- Purpose "examine issues related to the shortage of volunteer firefighters and emergency medical technicians (EMTs) in the state, particularly in rural areas, and propose measures to address the shortage."

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WI Legislative Council Committee Recommendations to WTCS

- &Maximize online training based on demand and broadband availability
- \diamond Maximize on-site training in rural areas
- ♦ Improve coordination and communication about course offerings
- \diamondsuit Address statewide disparities in course completion and NREMT success

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WTCS Response to Committee Recommendations

- $\boldsymbol{\diamond}$ Leverage district EMS education resources more effectively
 - ♦ Support primary EMS education as required for local providers
 - $\boldsymbol{\diamondsuit}$ Support continuing education through traditional refresher training
 - ♦ Support continuing education through flexible refresher training
 - ♦ Other training as requested EVOC, CPR, ACLS, etc.

DHS-EMS Section & WTCS Goals

- ♦ Work with services to create an integrated education plan
- * Create partnerships as we develop best practices in this program
- ♦ Look for opportunities to improve the process
- ♦ Ensure all educational offerings are NCCP complaint (NREMT)

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Changes in the Renewal Process

- ♦ 2017 Assembly Bill AB 356
 - An Act to amend 256.15 (5) (a) and 256.15 (10); and to create 256.15 (8) (cm) of the statutes; Relating to: licensure or certificate renewal for certain emergency medical services personnel and ambulance service providers. (FE)
 - ♦ Increase licensing period from 2 to 3 years, starting in 2020 (2023)
 - ♦ Increases EMS CE requirements for renewal (x 1.5)

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EMS Operational Plan WI Administrative Code DHS 110.47(5)

- designee who is responsible for assisting the service medical director in assuring continued competency and facilitating the continuing education of the provider's EMS personnel
- \otimes Works in collaboration with service leadership, most specifically the service medical director
- $\otimes \operatorname{Ensures}$ EMS providers have proper support for ongoing education

EMS Training Officer Training and Experience

- ♦ Suggested minimum five (5) years field experience as an EMS provider ♦ equivalency as determined by the service medical director
- ♦ Suggested minimum two (2) years EMS training and education experience ♦ equivalency as determined by the service medical director is allowable

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EMS Training Officer Training and Experience

- ♦ EMS Training Officer does not need to be a subject matter expert (SME)
- $\boldsymbol{\diamond}$ Needs the ability to recognize the training and education needs of service
- ♦ Be able to secure a credentialed person (SME) to deliver content

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EMS Training Officer Training and Experience

- ♦ Required to be familiar with current National EMS Education Standards
- ♦ Licensure as EMS Instructor I or II is desirable
- * Affiliation with a state-approved EMS training center is desirable
- ♦ Instructor certifications in related programs is also desirable

EMS Training Officer Job Duties

- * Implements and coordinates training to maintain currency of providers.
- ♦ Implements and coordinates a comprehensive EMS CE program
- * Provides specialized training, if required
- $\boldsymbol{\diamond}$ Participates in outreach training and education within the community.
- ♦ Oversees orientation of new providers, including skills knowledge, etc.
- $\boldsymbol{\diamondsuit}$ Helps organize and participates in EMS provider training requirements.

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EMS Training Officer Job Duties (cont.)

- ♦ Maintains education and training records for their EMS agency
- ♦ Identifies long-term, sustainable education and training needs
- ♦ Develops and sustains a Process Improvement (PI) program
- ♦ Stays current with local, state and national EMS research trends
- ♦ Attends and participates in EMS management team meetings

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EMS Training Officer Job Duties (cont.)

- * Participates in ongoing education and training for training officers
- & Ensures training equipment is maintained in accordance with agency policy
- ♦ Provides members with online EMS education and training opportunities
- ♦ Performs other related duties as assigned

EMS CE Application Attachment 1

- * Completed by EMS Training Officer
- ❖ Top block of the application contains program logistics
- $\boldsymbol{\diamondsuit}$ Body of application contains specific training templates, etc.
- Signatures

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EMS CE Application Attachment 1

- \Leftrightarrow EMS CE duplicated on different days/times submitted separately
- ♦ EMS CE training can recorded and viewed as needed
 ♦ Service can create a YouTube® channel for this purpose
- ♦ All applications must be completed and approved prior to delivery

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EMS CE Application – Template Specific Attachment 1

- $\ensuremath{\diamond}$ Changes must be pre-approved to include date revised and signatures.
- $\ \, \& \ \,$ All past schedules should be archived for a period of 7 years.

Acknowledgement Page Attachment 2

- $\boldsymbol{\diamond}$ completed and signed both the EMS Training Officer Medical Director
- ♦ must be updated if either EMS Training Officer/Medical Director change

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EMS CE Instructor Application Attachment 3

- ♦ Intended to identify persons considered competent to deliver content
- ♦ Validation/verification is responsibility of EMS medical director
- ♦ Delivered by EMS provider/instructor at or above the level of instruction
- ♦ Content delivered by SME with the appropriate training and experience
- ♦ Each person delivering CE content must have instructor approval

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State of Wisconsin EMS Continuing Education Sign-In Sheet Attachment 4

- $\boldsymbol{\diamond}$ EMS CE training delivered through this program must have sign-in sheet
- ♦ Must be maintained for a period of seven years for review/audit purposes
- ♦ Ensure EMS CE Courses are entered into e-licensing
- ♦ Ensure CE sign-in sheets (.PDF) are uploaded into e-licensing

EMS Skills Validation Attachment 5

- ♦ EMS CE for validation of EMS skills is allowable (recommended)
- ♦ Allows service members remain competent in their skills/scope of practice
- ♦ Complete EMS Training Officer Program EMS CE Training Roster
- ♦ Reference S&P Manual and state scope of practice document

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EMS CE Application Templates Attachment 6

- ♦ Contains 24 NCCP-compliant CE templates (NREMT)
- $\boldsymbol{\diamond}$ NREMT accepts all EMS CE approved by WI DHS-EMS Section
- \Leftrightarrow EMS agency selects topics for delivery and adds them to application
- & EMS agency can opt to create their own EMS CE offering (7-1 and 7-2)

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EMS CE Approval Process

- 1. Completed applications sent to service medical director for approval
- 2. Service Medical Director approves application and instructor(s)
- 3. Retains approved applications for seven years for review/audit purposes

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Submission of Training Course

♦ EMS Training Officer submits approved application (.PDF) into e-licensing ♦ https://www.wi-emss.org/public/wisconsin

Submission of EMS CE Training

- ♦ All EMS CE training sign-in sheets must be submitted into ε-licensing
- ♦ Submission required within 72 hours of EMS CE completion

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Submission of EMS Provider Recertification

- * Alternate Flexible Refresher Form
 - ♦ https://www.dhs.wisconsin.gov/ems/licensing/renewal.htm
- ♦ Make sure form is signed by applicant, service director and medical director
- ♦ Uploaded into e-licensing
 - ♦ https://www.wi-emss.org/public/wisconsi

- $\ensuremath{\diamond}$ Developing training program for EMS Training Officers
 - ♦ EMS Instructor II certification course/orientation
 - ♦ EMS CE education topics
 - ♦ Orientation in the use of e-licensing to document training
 - ♦ Other training identified
