#### WHAT DO THE LITURGICAL COLORS MEAN?

Recently, I have been asked about the stoles I wear, and the significance of the colors of the stoles. I will try to explain the meaning of the stoles and their colors. The stole itself represents the yoke of ministry placed upon me through the calling of God and the affirmation of the United Methodist Church. As pastors, the stole reminds us of the responsibility and weight we carry as a minister of the Gospel. Stoles come in four colors, purple or blue, white, green, and red. The liturgical calendar beginning the first Sunday of Advent is made of two cycles: Christmas and Easter. Each cycle is divided into three parts:

Christmas (1st cycle)

- 1) Advent purple/blue
- 2) Christmas & Epiphany white
- 3) Ordinary time green

Easter (2<sup>nd</sup> cycle)

- 1) Lent purple/blue
- 2) Easter white
- 3) Ordinary time green

Each color signifies a specific attribute of each season. Besides purple/blue, white and green, there is a fourth color, red, which is used once a year for Pentecost.

Purple/Blue—represents royalty and repentance

White—represents purity, joy and festivities

Green—represents growth

Red—represents the fire of the Holy Spirit descending at Pentecost As we go through the year, think about the season of the year and the colors representing that season.
