Jacob saw a lot of faces. Men and women with briefcases and backpacks bumped him. Everywhere he looked, he saw strangers.


He heard the subway train roaring through the station. He heard hundreds of voices. Brakes screeched as a subway train stopped. A new crowd of strangers walked onto the platform.
