

# A Voice from the Wilderness – "Make Straight the Path of the Lord"

Advent has always been a much-needed time to the draw backfrom the busyness, challenges and demands of everyday life and as we look towards commemorating the coming of the Child Jesus into the world, we need to take another look at our priorities, values and how or if we proclaim the Gospel mission of hope in our living and interractions with others. This has always been the Hope of Advent- the embedding of the mercy, justice and peace of God into creation and human living. True hope is not a passive emotion; it provokes active commitment to removing obstructions to making the path straight for the entry of God's mercy and love into our lives and the lives of all God's children.

As in tragic and overwhelming times over the ages the people of the prophet Isaiah's time needed to hear words of hope and comfort. They, like peoples in our present times were in a wilderness of exile or resettlement —deprived of security and peaceful existence through political oppression, wars, poverty or social status, security or communal support. What path could they follow? In the first reading today, God gives directions to the Comforters. Firstly, speak tenderly. They have already suffered and don't need to be reminded of wrong doing of the past. Second, proclaim that their sins are forgiven and God's mercy will be poured out in abundance. Thirdly, what must they do? They must transform and reshape the landscape of their hearts.

Like many of the prophets who went before him John the Baptiser came out of a wilderness world preaching - not a political revolution but a revolution of the heart. His baptism was not about initiation or belonging, but conversion. It was a sign of God's call, 'Come back to me with all your heart'. Change your perceptions and way of living to be true proclaimers and examples of My kingdom present among you.

Advent for us is also a time of renewal as we look forward to celebrating with family and church the coming of God into the world in the form of a child born into poor circumstances – a reminder that the presence of God is already with us calling us to be welcomers, comforters, and protectors in His name. When we read of people who use their talents, social positions and possessions to bring hope and comfort to those who are poor – physically, emotionally and communally -we begin to know what 'God with us' means.

A Rabbi once asked a group of learned men: "Where is the dwelling place of God?" They laughed at him. "What a thing to ask" they said. "Is not the the whole world full of God's glory?" Then the Rabbi answered his own question. "God dwells wherever people let God in".

May the peace of Advent be with us all.
