#### Wire Act in Court

One judge and upwards of twenty attorneys met in a courtroom in New Hampshire in April to begin the legal wrangling over the U.S. Justice Department opinion that reversed a 2011 memorandum that the 1961 Wire Act applied only to sports betting, paving the way for Internet and interstate gambling in the United States. Assistant U.S. attorneys and lawyers representing groups such as the Coalition To Stop Internet Gambling and the National Association of Convenience Stores faced off against counterparts representing the states of Michigan, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania, siding with New Hampshire, which initiated the lawsuit against the federal government. The District Court judge declared that the Wire Act is a grammatical mess; denied the government's move to dismiss

#### **Mega Millions**

After dropping \$40 into a Megabucks machine at Sunset Station and playing for two minutes, a player from Arizona lined up the three Megabucks symbols on a Triple Red Hot Sevens slot machine to take down the jackpot of \$13,154,723.

#### **Oklahoma Casino Count**

Oklahoma now has the third most casinos in the U.S. with 141, trailing only Nevada and California. This includes the giant WinStar Casino in Thackerville near the Texas border, that advertises itself as the world's largest casino with 600,000 square feet of floor space.

#### West Virginia Approves Online Casinos

West Virginia has become the fifth state to legalize online casinos or poker (both were approved there), joining Nevada, New Jersey, Delaware, and Pennsylvania. Online sports betting is already underway in West Virginia, but casino and poker won't begin until prospective operators—likely the state's existing bricks-and-mortar casinos—have been issued online licenses.

## **Bingo Halls Raided**

The battle over Bingo in Alabama rages on. In the latest salvo, authorities went after four Bingo halls in Jefferson County and arrested close to 20 people. Officials from the Alabama Attorney General's Office raided the Spin It and Win It Charity Bingo hall in Graysville, Super Highway Bingo in Brighton, Fun-N-Games Arcade in Brighton and Southwind Bingo in Midfield. State officials raided the halls as part of ongoing disagreements between Alabama Attorney General Steve Marshall and Jefferson County Sheriff Mark Pettway on the issue.

### Prime Minister Dodges Reporters for Bingo Event

Reporters and the outlets they work for were plenty upset when handlers for Australian Prime Minister Scott Morrison gave journalists the night off during a stop on his re-election campaign. Only afterward did they find out that they missed covering the prime minister's visit to a veterans club in Sydney where he sat in as a caller during a Bingo session. As a result of "Bingo-gate," some media bosses questioned whether the high cost of having reporters on the campaign trail is worth the effort, especially if handlers plan to pick and choose the events where the press are allowed, such as in this case at the Bingo hall, where they apparently worried Morrison might do something to create bad press.

## New Indian Nation Bingo Opens

The Sac and Fox Nation of Missouri in Kansas and Nebraska recently celebrated the grand opening of a new Bingo hall at Sac & Fox Casino in Powhattan, Kansas, with a ribbon cutting ceremony and other festivities. The decision to bring Bingo to the casino was made with the goal of attracting a wider range of customers. The new, 6,000-sq.-ft. complex includes an enclosed Silver Fox Showroom with 600 seats and a 240-seat Bingo hall located adjacent to it. Construction began in January 2019 and was completed within three months.

## Fundraiser Draws Players from Three States

Every spring for the past 32 years, Burns and Carpenter elementary schools in Wyoming have held a major Bingo fundraiser to collect much-needed financial support for school activities and programs. The event has grown so big that last year more than 650 people from Nebraska, Colorado and Wyoming attended. Players are served walking tacos and compete in Bingo games, raffles and a silent auction. Prizes range from a drone and an air hockey table to a Fitbit, a crossbow and an Amazon Echo.

## "Steamed" Follows Up on Splitting Wins

When that happened, instead of sharing it, she gave me half (\$50) of a smaller previous prize I'd won and split with her and told me she didn't want to share our Bingo winnings anymore. She kept the entire \$850 for herself.

This stunt really made me mad, and I told her so while we were still sitting at Bingo. I said it was obvious she did this to keep the big jackpot, and to me this was greedy and selfish. At the time I also said that I had no problem not sharing our Bingo winnings anymore, but that she shouldn't have waited until there was a big prize to cheat me out of.

All she said in return was that she was "sorry I felt that way" and behaved as if I was the one making a big deal about the money and not her—which is what made me decide to write to you.

I very much appreciate that you published my story and shared your advice, and I want to thank all the people who wrote in with their comments. It was interesting to see that I was not the only one who has been burned by a "splitting our winnings" arrangement.

Having never seen someone write in with an update, I thought I would take a moment and tell you what has happened since.

My cousin and I didn't speak for a while. She finally phoned me after she saw my letter in your column and asked if I had sent it. When I told her I had, she called me mentally ill and hung up.

The next thing I know, I'm hearing from other relatives and friends, some who say I was perfectly right to be angry and to have sent you the email, and others who think I am wrong for airing a family quarrel in public.

Oddly, when I ask the people who tell me I was wrong about the letter what they think of her keeping the money, most all of them say the same thing: That's not the issue; the issue is that I went public with my complaint.

problems soars (24%) during that same period. They coordinated with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for flu stats, and concentrated on four specific communities in Maryland, North Carolina, Mississippi and Minnesota. While a correlation between the flu and heart failure has long been suspected, this large study nails it with real numbers. If you're already a heart patient, don't depend on the doctors to send you a note about getting your flu shot. Get one. If you're otherwise healthy, take responsibility for getting your shot, and make sure others around you get it too, especially children. You can find the shots everywhere, including the local pharmacy and chain grocery stores.

• Commit to other solutions that may help make your town more dog-friendly: remind other dog owners to pick up droppings, post flyers that explain how to approach a strange dog, and of course, keep Greta on a leash

Some of us just don't want to get a flu shot every year. It's too much trouble to get an appointment, or we just don't like needles — or maybe we figure that we'll just tough it out for a week if we do get the flu. After all, it's not going to kill us, right?

A researcher at the Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Minneapolis has come up with a strong reason to get an annual flu shot: You could have a heart attack if you don't.

After studying 450,000 medical records of four flu seasons, the VA researcher and his colleagues concluded that while the number of flu cases might go up only slightly (5%) in a given month, the number of heart-related While the 2018-2019 flu season is practically over, get started early for the next round by paging through your calendar to September and October and making a note to get a flu shot then.


**A:** It can be frustrating to have to go so far to give Greta some recreation time. Here are a few ideas to try:

I'm happy to oblige, and I agree. This once-a-decade job opportunity is a great fit for retirees that have some free time on their hands who wouldn't mind earning some extra income while helping the community.

#### **Attention Retirees!**

The United States Census Bureau is currently in the process of recruiting over 500,000 temporary workers to help carry out the upcoming 2020 Census national head count of every person living in the U.S. The U.S Census helps

determines each state's

representation in Congress, how funds are spent for schools, hospitals, roads, and provides information to guide many decisions made by government agencies, private businesses and institutions.

Jobs within the census vary from working in the field canvassing, updating maps, doing follow up interviews with citizens in your community, or working in the office as a clerk doing administrative tasks or office operation supervisor, who oversees the field staff.

Some jobs will begin this summer, but the majority of positions will begin in late April 2020 and last a month or two.

These temporary part-time positions are located in every county throughout the United States and Puerto Rico. Some positions require evening and/ or weekend shifts because you must be available to interview members of the public when they're at home. And all positions require several days of online and classroom training. The pay ranges between \$13.50 and \$30 per hour depending on position and location. #### Job Qualifications

To be able to work for the 2020 census you must be:

- Be at least 18 years old.
- Have a valid Social Security number.
- Be a U.S. citizen.



• Complete an application and answer assessment questions.

• Be registered with the Selective Service System or have a qualifying exemption, if you are a male born after Dec. 31, 1959.

• Pass a Census-performed criminal background check and a review of criminal records, including fingerprinting.

• Commit to completing training.

• Be available to work flexible hours, which can include days, evenings, and/or weekends. In addition, most census jobs require employees to have access to a vehicle and a valid driver's license, unless public transportation is readily available. And have access to a computer with internet and an email account to complete training.

#### How to Apply

The first step is to complete the online job application at 2020census.gov/en/jobs. The process takes about 30 minutes and will include some assessment questions about your education, work, and other experience. If you're a veteran who would like to claim veterans' preference, which provides preference over nonveteran applicants, you'll need supporting documentation. After you apply, an interviewer will reach out to potential hires to conduct a phone interview, but not all applicants will be interviewed. Job offers are made verbally, but candidates will also receive a letter by email.



## Mass. Lotto Upgrade

The Massachusetts Lottery got a much-needed tech boost this year, with the replacement of its IT system, which was more than 20 years old. The new system connects more than 7,500 lottery terminals that were rolled out last year. Officials say the IT upgrade will ensure the stability of the system, which brings in approximately \$1 billion in profits to cities and towns each fiscal year. The expanded digital footprint also positions the lottery to engage with customers on other platforms, such as online lottery, should the state approve it. The new IT system was the final step in a multi-year project that cost more than \$50 million.

A Michigan man will be getting \$25,000 a year for life after rescuing his lotto ticket from the garbage. Jeff Heinig of Harrison, Michigan, rescued his Lucky for Life ticket from the trash after he initially tossed it thinking it was worthless. He said he threw the ticket away after he got his dates mixed up and checked the website before the drawing took place. "I was back on the website and the Lucky For Life numbers caught my eye," he said. "They were the numbers I always play, and that's when it hit me that I had checked my ticket before the drawing had happened. I searched high and low for the ticket but couldn't find it anywhere until I went rifling through the trash."









are changing their policy toward video poker players, and this often is not good news for them. I'll give you a few examples so you will be aware of these revised casino policies.

A Mississippi casino recently posted the following banner on their web site: "9/6 VIDEO POKER MACHINES...36 NOW AVAILABLE." I got excited and paid the casino a visit to see for myself. Sure enough, I found 36 slant-top video poker machines that had 9/6 Jacks or Better games on them. However, as I glanced over the entire pay table, I noticed something that made me sick to my stomach; namely, they had shorted the max-coin royal flush payout from 4,000 coins to only 2,500 coins at all denominations (25 cents, 50 cents, and dollar).

This reduction in the payoff for the royal flush decreases the Expected Value from 99.54% to 98.39%. Now, you might think a reduction in ER of 1.15% is not a big deal, but for serious players, trust me, it is. I had a short meeting with the casino's slot manager to voice my displeasure over their shorted royal flush payout. Casino management revisited this issue and subsequently changed the payout to 4,000 coins on their quarter denomination 9/6 Jacks or Better machines (at 50 cents and dollar denomination, the payout is still 2,500 coins). The point is this: you need to be diligent and check the entire video poker pay table to be sure none of the payouts have been shorted.

Many casinos have changed how they determine a player's monthly mailer (specifically, the amount of bounce back cash, free play, and other comps in the mailers). The amount of perks that players got in their monthly mailers used to be based on either their coin in over a period of time or their daily average coin in. Nowadays, casinos are basing a player's mailer on theoretical (or "theo"), meaning how much average profit the casino expects to earn from a player based on the specific machine they play. So video poker players that play, say 9/6 Jacks or Better, will get much less bounce back free play and comps in their mailers compared to a player who plays a video poker game with a worse pay schedule.

The following policy change blows my mind. Some casinos factor in a player's win/loss history in their equation that determines how much a player will get in their mailers. Get lucky and hit a royal flush (or a jackpot on a slot machine) and the amount of bounce back and comps in your mailers will dramatically decrease.

Some casinos decrease the rewards a player receives for


playing a full pay video poker machine. Instead of having to wager, say 1,000 coins, to get a point on their slot card, signage on the machine will state that you need to wager 4,000 coins for a point (thus it takes more coin in to get a point). Several casinos have even gone so far as to post signage on their full pay video poker machines that state when you play this machine you will get zero points and you won't be eligible for any promotions. (No, I'm not kidding...absolutely no incentives for a player.)

Many casinos actively promote bonus point promotions to video poker and slot players. Unfortunately, when some video poker players took the casino up on their offer while playing full-play video poker games, their mailers were discontinued.

So what should a smart video poker do if their favorite casino changes their policy toward video poker players for the worse? You have two choices: voice your displeasure with management, making sure they know you will be playing there a lot less, or find another casino that will offer you a better deal for your play.



Riess only had 355,000 behind and again was put to a tough decision. Was Foxen bleeding him with an ace? As the saying goes, "In for a penny, in for a pound."

Riess called once again, and the Kd completed the board on the river.

Foxen got lucky to take the lead, and he checked. Why not bet? Because it was a situation where he was only going to get called by a hand that beat him - in this case an ace. Why bet and give Riess more chips if he did have an ace? If Riess had a queen (which he did), he probably wouldn't call a bet anyway. So, betting was high risk, no reward.

There was no sense in Riess betting at this point either. Like his opponent, he would only get called by better hands. So, checkcheck it went, and Foxen claimed the pot.

As poker fate would have it, Foxen saw his big stack disappear and busted out in fourth place for \$328,000, while Riess spun up his short stack and finished in second place for \$492,000.

The Hotel Apache opened in 1929 and was originally owned by a cement contractor for Hoover Dam. It was the first Las Vegas hotel to have air-conditioning in the lobby, protected by an air curtain at the entrance. It was also the first with an elevator and a carpeted casino. Eventually acquired by Benny Binion, it has been closed for a number of years, but 80 rooms just reopened as a boutique hotelwithin-a-hotel. Binion's is touting it as downtown's "Historic Haunted Hotel" and the remodeled rooms are going for \$99 weekdays and \$199 weekends.



## Curry for Friends who Love Curry

#### Dear Annie,

I have two very good friends who are coming for a visit this summer. They love recipes with curry. Can you suggest an entree made with curry? Thanks for all your wonderful recipes. — **Sasha Ann from New York** 

#### Dear Sasha Ann,

I have a son who loves curry, too. Here's one of his favorite recipes. There are a lot of ingredients, but the recipe is worth the effort. Double this recipe if you are serving more than four people. Enjoy! — Annie

#### CURRIED CHICKEN AND APPLES

1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> pounds skinless, boneless chicken breast and thighs 3 tablespoons olive oil 2 medium onions, chopped 2 large cloves garlic, minced 4 large tart apples (Granny Smith), peeled, cored and cut in eights 2 teaspoons ground cumin 1 teaspoon ground coriander <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> teaspoon turmeric <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> teaspoon cinnamon 1/8 teaspoon cloves 1/8 teaspoon nutmeg 1/8 teaspoon cardamom salt, to taste pepper, to taste <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> teaspoon hot red pepper flakes 2 cups reduced sodium chicken stock or broth 2 tablespoons corn starch 1 tablespoon lime juice 1 cup nonfat plain yogurt

Cut the chicken on the diagonal into ½ inch strips. In a nonstick pan, brown the chicken strips on both sides in hot oil. Remove and set aside. Add the onions to the pan and sauté, cooking until they begin to brown and soften. Add the garlic and cook for 30 seconds. Reduce the heat to medium and add the apples, all the spices, and the salt, pepper and hot pepper flakes. Return the chicken to the pot, cover, and cook over low heat until the apples begin to soften, just a few minutes.

Mix a little of the stock with the cornstarch to make a smooth paste and stir the paste into the remaining chicken stock. When the chicken is almost cooked, add the cornstarch mixture and cook over a low heat, stirring, until the mixture thickens a little. Add the lime juice. Refrigerate, if desired.

To serve, let the chicken return to room temperature and reheat very slowly over low heat or in the microwave. Serve over rice, with yogurt on the side. Yield: 4 servings. Double this recipe if you are serving more than four people.


