For the months of Jan. and Feb., we will be reading a book called <u>Something</u>


<u>Other Than God</u> by Jennifer Fulwiler.

"On February 17, 1950, Bishop George L. Leech of Harrisburg made Shippensburg a parish in its own right. This church would also be responsible for the mission chapel of Doylesburg. Dolyesburg was part of the parish until 1965. On February 18th, Father Norman Koller took up residence at the Hotel Shippens. Fr. Koller was a native of Buffalo, New York. Daily Mass was started on February 19, 1950.

In 1950 the Hosfeld property, 4.5 acres and buildings was purchased for the parish. A large house was remodeled to include the rectory and small meeting rooms. A former stable was made into a chapel. This was a time of anti-Catholic feelings in the general area populace. On Sunday December 3, 1950, the Holy Mass was offered for the first time on the new site."
