## Sand Key Beach and Sunset at Pier 60 on Clearwater Beach Monday August 19th from

## 11 am - 11 pm

## While at the beach everyone should stay for at least one sunset in their life.

Summer heat on the beach:

During the last two beach trips, we've had THREE heat related health incidents. They have ranged from disorientation and fainting to seizures and unresponsiveness. Just in case your mirror is being kind and you haven't noticed, we are ALL getting older and heat/dehydration affect us more, as in MUCH more, than it ever did before. And the heat this summer is more oppressive - more humidity with higher temperatures. There are heat advisories/warnings nearly every day in The Villages.

We've been extremely fortunate so far.....with EMTs just around the corner and other first responders helping out. But we are unwilling to continue to rely on our procedures and plain luck to get us through the August trip.

Before you sign up for this trip, you must commit to staying hydrated while on the beach, seeking shade or air conditioning when you begin to feel too warm and realizing that what you could do last summer might be different than what you can do this summer, in this heat. This trip, since it departs later, will expose you to more of the summer heat.

We had so much fun last summer with our 'late departure' trip and so many of the folks on last year's trip wanted to do it again, that we decided to offer it again this summer while the days are long. We will still end up in the town of Clearwater Beach, but only for dinner and Sunset at Pier 60. We will spend our beach time at the more serene (and significantly less crowded) Sand Key Beach, just across Clearwater harbor.

We know you visit the beach just to relax, read a book, take in the beauty, or maybe even sleep, and we know just the perfect beach for all of that and more. Sand Key, with its wide swath of powder-soft sand and gentle surf has often been voted one of the nation's top beaches.

It is a serenely quiet beach where you can transport yourself from the craziness of The Villages to a slice of tropical paradise designed for sunning, swimming, and relaxation. But, sunset on the beach is an experience on a different level.

Plan on sleeping-in because we do not depart until 11 am in order to still be on the beach at **8:05 pm** to view the awesome sunset on Clearwater Pier 60.

We will arrive on Sand Key Beach around 1 pm. This is a pretty wide beach, so if you are not up to walking a fair distance, this trip is not for you. There are a couple of beach wheelchairs available in the park that we could try to secure if needed, but we would not be guaranteed their usage.

We have made arrangements with the beach equipment rental folks on Sand Key to pre-pay your discounted chairs and umbrella rentals. Prepaying the equipment also insures that it will be available when we arrive. Given the depth of the beach, this is a great option at a reasonable price! You will need to indicate on your reservation form what you want to rent and you will need to include the payment with your trip fee/reservation form.

- Umbrella \$20 per day + 18% gratuity
- Lounge chair \$15 per day + 18% gratuity
- Two lounge chairs & umbrella \$30 + 18% gratuity

Both the restroom and bathhouse are located on the beach, as well as a concession stand right in the park. There is a **food truck on Sand Key Beach** that sells hot dogs, chicken strips, and ice cream. For beachgoers with more sophisticated palates, the Sheraton Sand Key Resort, which borders the south end of the park, has a Poolside Cafe open 11:30am-3:00pm serving sandwiches, nachos, and veggie wraps; less than a <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> mile walk. In addition, the Sheraton Resort sports the Mainstay Tavern which opens at 12pm with a gastropub type menu and local craft beers. No alcohol is allowed on the beach so this might be a place you want to visit.

After we've had our fill of sun and sand, we will board the bus at 5 pm to take in the sunset at Pier 60 on Clearwater Beach (a 15 minute ride). We will arrive at the Clearwater Beach area in plenty of time for you to take a short walk to one of the area restaurants, have dinner, even shop a bit and return to the Pier 60 area for the sunset festivities.

The Sunset Festival at Pier 60 is a hidden gem to the locals. At **8:05 pm** on Monday, if you stand out over the gulf on any spot of their 609 foot pier you will see a white-capped ocean, and a signature sunset. The festival begins two hours prior to sunset (8:05 pm) which would make it around 6 p. And runs for 2 hours after sunset....or 6-10 pm. (No, we will be long gone by the time they close up on the pier!)

We may have the opportunity to observe a daring live performance, (men walking on stilts or swallowing fire). Plus, the vendors only sell handcrafted artwork. You will have plenty of time to have dinner before sunset happens. A few restaurants are listed below for your convenience. **Dinner Restaurants:** We will send a map with your Trip Details for your convenience so you can find them all. These are all pretty high quality restaurants, probably because there is so much competition. We have not had a bad meal in Clearwater Beach yet.

Pier 60 has a full-feature fishing pier at its end. If you just want to walk to the end and gaze off into the Gulf, there is a \$1 fee, payable in the shop situated on the pier. They also rent fishing poles, sell bait and issue fishing permits, and are run by the City of Clearwater. The daily fishing fee for seniors is \$8; rod rental is \$10, but you can bring your own as well. We heard that the night fishing is terrific.

Clearwater Beach also has adventures unlike most of the beaches we visit. If you want a sea adventure, the selection at Clearwater is comprehensive. There is the Calypso Queen, Sea Screamer, Waverunner Rentals & Tours, Encounter with Dolphins, and Captain Memo's Pirate Cruise. Captain Memo's offers a sunset cruise that leaves the dock at 7 pm with a discounted price for seniors. We can tell you that Captain Memo's cruise was a big hit with our members last year. If several of you decide to take the sunset cruise , we will delay our departure for home by a few minutes to allow you to disembark from the 2-hour tour and cross the street to board your waiting bus. Reservations for the pirate sunset tour are suggested. You can make those by checking their website and following the instructions.<u>http://captainmemo.com/</u>. Be sure to select the senior rate!

We recommend that you be back at the pier by 7:30pm. (unless you have been whisked away on the pirate ship) at the latest so you can enjoy the entertainment, browse artisan vendor items and find a perch on the pier to gaze out at the beautiful sunset, that is, if you are not perched on a rooftop bar! At 9pm, we will reluctantly board our buses to head back to The Villages, arriving around 11pm.
