Sunday, November 18, 2018 Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Of that day or hour, no one knows" (Mark 13:32). When Jesus said that "no one knows" when the Second Coming would happen, was He saying that even He didn't know? It sure seems that way. Maybe He was reminding us that He had submitted to the limitations of being human, just like us. Yes, He was fully divine, but He was also fully human. And that entailed certain limitations. This is why Luke tells us that Jesus was always increasing in wisdom "before God and man" (Luke 2:52).

Today, however, Jesus knows when He will come again. The problem is, we still don't know! Repeatedly throughout history, people have tried to predict the end of the world. St. Paul thought it was just around the corner. St. Hippolytus of Rome and St. Irenaeus of Lyon thought it would happen in AD 500. John Wesley, the first Methodist, thought the end would come in 1836. Many Christian leaders--and no shortage of psychics--have also weighed in. Not surprisingly, many of these people then recalculated the dates after their first predictions didn't come true, only to have their followers disappointed again.

Some believers are more cautious. They tell us that we will see specific clues when the time is near. They point to certain signs--a war in the Middle East, a drought in Africa, earthquakes in Peru, or some other disaster. When those signs occur, they think it means that Jesus is very near. Still, no human being knows when Jesus will come. It could be today. It may not be for thousands of years.

St. Francis had a different take on the subject. Once, when he was working in the garden, a friar asked, "What would you be doing now if you knew that Jesus was coming back today?" Francis replied, "I would keep hoeing my garden." Francis knew he was trying his best to be ready, and there was nothing more he could do. The point is, Jesus *will* come. So our best answer is the same as it has always been: be ready!

"De aquel día y hora, nadie sabe" (Marcos 13:32). ¿Cuando Jesús dijo que "nadie sabe" cuando ocurriría la segunda venida, estaba diciendo que aún no sabía? Parece que de esa manera. Tal vez él se nos recuerda que él había sometido a las limitaciones del ser humano, al igual que nosotros. Sí, él era completamente divino, pero también era plenamente humano. Y que implica ciertas limitaciones. Por eso Lucas nos dice que Jesús fue siempre aumentando en sabiduría "antes de Dios y el hombre" (Lucas 2:52).

Hoy, sin embargo, Jesús sabe cuándo vendrá otra vez. El problema es que no sabemos! Repetidamente a lo largo de la historia, las personas han intentado predecir el fin del mundo. San Pablo pensaba que era a la vuelta de la esquina. St Hipólito de Roma y St Irenaeus de Lyon pensaban que ocurriría en el 500 D.C.. John Wesley, el primer Metodista, pensé el final llegaría en 1836. Muchos líderes cristianos, y no faltan los psíquicos--también han pesado. No en vano, muchas de estas personas entonces vuelve a calcular las fechas después de sus primeras predicciones no es true, sólo para que sus seguidores decepcionados otra vez.

Algunos creyentes son más cautelosos. Nos dicen que vamos a ver pistas específicas cuando el tiempo está cerca. Señalan ciertos signos--una guerra en Medio Oriente, una sequía en África, los terremotos en Perú o algún otro desastre. Cuando estos signos se producen, piensan que significa que Jesús está muy cercano. Aún así, ningún ser humano sabe cuando vendrá Jesús. Podría ser hoy. No puede ser por miles de años.

St Francis tuvo una toma diferente sobre el tema. Una vez, cuando estaba trabajando en el jardín, un fraile le preguntó, "qué ¿se haces ahora si supieras que Jesús volvía hoy?" Francisco respondió: "Yo sería mantener escardas mi jardín." Francisco sabía que estaba tratando su mejor estar listo, y no había nada más que podía hacer. El punto es que Jesús vendrá. Así que nuestra mejor respuesta es la misma que siempre ha sido: ¡prepárate!
