Our speaker today was Eric Sponholtz, Literacy Green Bay's executive director. Since 1981, his organization has helped 9,000 students from 99 countries acquire reading, writing, language, and workforce skills. Eric currently has 110 tutors paired

with local adults. There's a waiting list of students. Literacy Green Bay provides childcare services while adults are taking classes. The hope is that their graduates will thrive in our community and provide a better life for themselves and their children.

We sincerely thank Eric for the work he does to make Green Bay a better home for everyone. Literacy Green Bay is part of the "Give Big Green Bay" program this year and we all wished him success in meeting his fundraising goals.
