The "marriage rate measures are each more important than the college attainment rate, age composition, or racial composition in predicting deaths of despair."



Number of newly married people per 1,000 unmarried Americans aged 15 and up



Number of newly divorced people per 1,000 married Americans





# 1) Success Sequence marked by 3 steps

Getting at least a HS degree

Working full-time in mid-20s


Marrying before having children

#### 97% of Young Adults Avoid Poverty

 94%+ lower-income and minority avoid Poverty

### 97% of adults who followed the success sequence are not poor

Notes: Based on adults surveyed in 2017-2018. Education and employed measured in 2010 when the cohort was in their mid 20s.





## Marriage = Stability; Baby First = Instability

- Men & women who put childbearing before marriage more likely to break up:
  - Single parenthood
  - Child support
  - Legal costs
  - Separate homes
