Hide – hide out of site of the active shooter's view and if you have time block or lock the entry to your hiding location. Remember in Fairfax County you can now text 9-1-1 once you are safe.

Fight – As a last resort only if your life is in immediate danger. Throw items at the active shooter

We "LEAF" It Up To You

Fortunately, we have a county program that allows us to rake our leaves to the curb for removal and.....unfortunately, we have a program that allows us to rake our leaves to the curb for removal. This program has both an upside and a downside.

The upside is that dealing with the enormous amount of leaves that are generated by the abundance of trees in our neighborhood is made easier by not having to rake and bag them.

The downside is that we end up with streets that are messy and sometimes unsafe for our residents. This program makes the probability of finding safe parking for our many private vehicles decrease and also makes the possibility of someone parking a warm vehicle over the leaves and starting a fire increase. Many piles also block the storm drains and create problems with standing water.

The <u>rounty</u> does not post their leaf collection dates on the yellow signs until a few days before the actual collection dates so it is somewhat of a guessing game as to when we need to have the leaves at the curb. Even though the average is one month between collections, some residents miss a date and rake their leaves to the curb afterward only to have them lay on the streets for almost a month. If we have high winds, the leaves may blow into other residents' yards and if they are piled too high, they become a driving hazard.

We must come up with our own solutions and make sure we are being considerate of our neighbors while taking into consideration the safety needs of all our residents. The following bullet points outline some measures we can put in place to help:

- Check the Fairfax county website that publishes the leaf pick-up dates for our zone which is zone 9 www.fairfaxcounty.gov/leaf
- Sign up to receive email announcements of the collection dates by signing up at this website
- Collections run from November to January and occur approximately one month apart be prepared
- If there is inclement weather, the dates will be moved.
- If you miss one date, consider not raking your leaves to the curb until we are closer to the next collection date.
