Many of you will recall his courage in delivering his annual update. The committee attempted to have Nick relax that evening, but he insisted that he could deliver his report as he had been doing for 26 years. Nick knew more about his condition than he was willing to impart to us, but this strong, gentle man battled to provide us with joy, as he had done for many years, when he was able to keep the organization afloat often with many innovative ideas to keep the price of a ticket reasonable over the years.


You may recall one year he was badly in need of financial support to balance the books and all hope was lost to ever having another reunion meeting. Mysteriously, he received a cheque from an individual to cover the needed support. A note attached ended with the initials, P.M. The following year another note arrived from P.M. from a "Federal institution" in the southern States. No cheque this time, but indicating that P.M. could not help with any financial support in the future. Some people speculated the P.M. stood for Patty Mitchell, but no one could ever prove it. Such was the humour of our departed Treasurer.

Nick held the position of Treasurer since the first Village Reunion in 1979. His organizational skills was evident when he successfully accommodated upwards of 650 people at our recent evenings.

Nora and Nick married in 1968 at St. Anthony's Church, the base for the Costantini and Corkery families for years. Their match was made in heaven. They raised four children and instilled in each one a sense of family. Some time before Nick's death, Nick and Nora's daughter and her husband, Maria and Michael, switched living accommodations on Woodside Drive. By this time, Nick was having difficulty ascending stairs, so they saw the solution by changing addresses, which they did.

In recent years, we have lost many friends from one reunion to the next. This year's reunion is decidedly subdued due to the loss of Nick.

He loved life and life loved him. Rest in peace, dear friend.





PATSY GUZZO

- 1914 PATRICK (PATSY) GUZZO, a member of the Ottawa-based RCAF Flyers, 1948 World Hockey Champions and Olympic gold medal winners, born at Ottawa, Ontario. An Ottawa Sports Hall of Fame inductee in 1985, he passed away on January 16, 1993.
- 1933 Ottawa Rough Riders 15 Toronto Argonauts 8 at Ottawa. Ottawa's Andy Tommy had a 112-yard fumble return touchdown. The Argonauts fumbled eight times. Ottawa and the Montreal Winged Wheelers were tied for first with 2-0-0 records.
- 1950 Ottawa Senators 2 Chicoutimi Sagueneens 1 before 5,500 at the Ottawa Auditorium in the opening game of the season in the Quebec Senior Hockey League. Stan Warecki, from Alan Kuntz and Bobby Copp, and Nils Tremblay, with help from Ray Trainor and Eddie Dartnell, were Ottawa's scorers. Lou Smrke scored for Chicoutimi.
- 1950 North Bay Black Hawks 8 Ottawa RCAF Flyers 3 at North Bay.

 Hugh Christie and Bo Elik each scored two goals for the
 winners. Frank Ringler, Chick Cecchini, Joe Lafrance, and
 Chick Gerarda added singles. Bob Greenlaw led Ottawa with a
 pair while TONY LICARI scored the other.

Other Commerce touchdowns came from Roger Karam, Cuthbert and Emile Smiley. Fisher Park downed St. Pat's in the Jr. A league with Danny Monk scoring two TDs and kicking two converts. Andy Fraser scored the other major, while Wayne Harris added a single. Jack Gosselin booted a single for St. Pat's.
- In the Gyro Night game at Lansdowne Park, Gord Ventura kicked a second-quarter single to account for the only scoring in a 1-0 win for St. Pat's over Fisher Park in Senior Interscholastic football played under high winds and driving rain conditions.
- 1955 In the Interscholastic Senior Football League, Gord Ventura of St. Pat's led all scorers with 13 points in three games. In Jr. A, Barry Larock of Lisgar and Gerry Post of Glebe were tied for the scoring leadership with 15 points apiece. In Jr. B, Joe Legari of Commerce had 31 points in his team's four wins.

1967 Brian Kilrea, Ottawa 67's' Head Coach and General Manager. scored the first goal for the Los Angeles Kings at 3:20 of the second period in a 4-2 victory over the Philadelphia Flyers at Los Angeles. He also scored the Kings' first empty-net goal at 19:44 of the third period.

1973 Ottawa Rough Riders 32 Calgary Stampeders 8 at Calgary. Jim Evenson scored two touchdowns for the winners with Hugh Oldham and Rod Woodward getting single majors. Woodward's score came on a 62-yard pass interception return. Piaskoski of the Riders had the CFL's longest fumble return of the season with an 87-yard scamper. Ottawa was in first place in the Eastern Conference with a record of 7-5-0-239-215-14.

1978 Denis Potvin, Ottawa 67's defenceman from 1968-69 to 1972-73, set the NHL record for the fastest three goals by a defenceman, 3:21, for the New York Islanders against the Toronto Maple Leafs.



1979 Ottawa Rough Riders 28 British Columbia Lions 26 at Ottawa before 25,708. Ottawa touchdowns were scored by Calvin Prince, on a 19-yard pass reception from Jimmy Jones, Condredge Holloway, on a one-yard run, and Richard Crump, also on a one-yard run. Ed Charuk also scored on a 14-yard pass from Joe Paopao. Ottawa was in second place, DENIS POTVIN behind Montreal Alouettes, in the Eastern Conference with a record of 7-4-2-315-264-16.
