1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to restrict access to certain restrooms and locker rooms in

2 public schools.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. That chapter 13-24 be amended by adding a NEW SECTION to read:

5 The term, biological sex, as used in this Act, means the physical condition of being male or

6 female as determined by a person's chromosomes and identified at birth by a person's anatomy.

7 Section 2. That the code be amended by adding a NEW SECTION to read:

8 Every restroom, locker room, and shower room located in a public elementary or secondary

9 school that is designated for student use and is accessible by multiple students at the same time

10 shall be designated for and used only by students of the same biological sex. In addition, any

11 public school student participating in a school sponsored activity off school premises which

- 12 includes being in a state of undress in the presence of other students shall use those rooms
- 13 designated for and used only by students of the same biological sex.
- 14 Section 3. That the code be amended by adding a NEW SECTION to read:



1 If any student asserts that the student's gender is different from the student's biological sex, 2 and if the student's parent or guardian consents to that assertion in writing to a public school 3 administrator, or if the student is an adult or an emancipated minor and makes the assertion in 4 writing to a public school administrator, the student shall be provided with a reasonable 5 accommodation. A reasonable accommodation is one that does not impose an undue hardship 6 on a school district. A reasonable accommodation may not include the use of student restrooms, 7 locker rooms, or shower rooms designated for use by students of the opposite biological sex if 8 students of the opposite biological sex are present or could be present. A reasonable 9 accommodation may include a single-occupancy restroom, a unisex restroom, or the controlled 10 use of a restroom, locker room, or shower room that is designated for use by faculty. The 11 requirement to provide a reasonable accommodation pursuant to this section does not apply to 12 any nonpublic school entity.

13 Section 4. That the code be amended by adding a NEW SECTION to read:

14 If any public school district, school district officer or employee, school board, or school 15 board member is sued in state or federal court as a result of a decision based upon and consistent 16 with a student's biological sex, notwithstanding any assertion that the student's gender is 17 different than the student's biological sex, the attorney general shall represent the school district, 18 school district officer or employee, school board, or school board member at no cost to the 19 school district, school district officer or employee, school board, or school board member, and 20 the State of South Dakota shall assume all financial responsibility for the legal expenses. The 21 legal expenses for which the state is responsible include any award for monetary damages or 22 attorneys' fees and costs which may be awarded and for which the school district, school district 23 officer or employee, school board, or school board member would otherwise be responsible.
