Firearm and horse paperwork required for Ontario Shoots

American Shooters please read all the information provided and fill out the forms provided. Allow several weeks in advance on the Short-Term Authorization to Transport (ST ATT) form.

Items required for competing in Canada if you are bringing your firearms/horses to Canada:

- 1) You must have a valid Passport to enter Canada
- 2) Temporary Export Horse Health Papers from your vet, and current Coggins. Make sure the vet is advised that you will be in Canada for less than 30 days and then provide the address of the shoot. Coggins must be within the last 6 months.
- 3) An Invitation Letter from the Ontario Cowboy Mounting Shooting Club. The OCMSA will provide this upon request.
- 4) Non-Resident Firearms Declaration Form 5589. <http://www.rcmp-grc.gc.ca/wam/media/2347/original/d369a605ac3363b569af5ea5dc40c88d.pdf> Have two copies filled out but DON'T sign until you arrive at the border and are in front of the border officer.
- 5) Continuation Sheet Form 5590 <http://www.rcmp-grc.gc.ca/wam/media/2351/original/effad04b4e53ef1ef40e5b00c73fd678.pdf> (only if needed - bringing in more than three guns).
- 6) Short Term Authorization to Transport (ST ATT). Phone number for the Chief Firearms Officer (CFO) 1 (800) 731-4000. They will ask for this form to be completed: <http://www.rcmp-grc.gc.ca/cfp-pcaf/faq/trans-eng.htm>. (RCMP Form 5490). You can fax or email. (When you call the CFO, they will advise what they want, and how you can send it in) **Allow several weeks for this to be approved – Then can email this to you when ready – ask for an emailed copy.**
- 7) For insurance purposes, you need to join the Ontario Equine Federation - <https://ontarioequestrian.ca/membership/>

Any barrel under 4.25” is prohibited and will not be allowed into Canada.

No live Ammo is to be brought to any OCMSA shoot or event. Firearms must have trigger locks on them and be transported in a locked case.

Anyone under 18 yrs. of age is prohibited from shooting a restricted firearm while mounted. If you have any family member under 18 yrs. please contact OCMSA in regards to the Wrangler Program in Canada.
