A word of caution: If you are making an item intended to go into a microwave, like a microwavable bowl or cozy, remember to use only 100% cotton and a batting that is approved for microwave use. Do not use anything with a metallic trim, as it may cause arcing or a fire. Batiks are also not advised.

Business:

Membership & door prizes: A variety of door prizes were awarded for those whose name was drawn.


