**Club Member's Projects** – Duane said he bought a GPS speedometer for his speedster.



**Next Club Meeting** – Wed, April 6 – Duane and Cathy Bunton's home in Roscoe.


#### In Memoriam



#### **Tech Seminar**

Ever wonder if your Model T coils are operating optimally? How do you know if a coil has a bad condenser? Is the timing properly set? How consistent is the firing? How much energy is being delivered to the spark plug? All those questions and more will be answered if you bring your coils to the **April 23<sup>rd</sup> Tech Seminar**. You'll have an opportunity to get your coils tested using an Electronically Cranked Coil Tester (ECCT). This device can simulate the engine running at different speeds and measures a number of coil parameters as shown below. Make plans to attend on April 23<sup>rd</sup> at 2 p.m. Location is 3783 Falling Leaf Drive, Rockford. Bring a chair and some coils!
