please continue to wear your mask and practice social distancing. The City buildings have made changes to be more hands-free and provide hand sanitizer to go along with the Health Department recommendations. I am looking forward to a fun summer.

The City of Willowick as well as many other nearby cities are experiencing labor shortages for seasonal help. Many cities are short lifeguards, camp counselors and maintenance workers. This is a nationwide problem and these issues will continue to affect hours of operation, or the number of people allowed to participate in any programs offered. This also has a profound effect on companies like Kimble who are also experiencing a shortage of workers. Kimble has asked us to be patient as they work to hire more qualified people to maintain their service. If they skip vard waste or a pickup of trash or recyclables, they will usually be back the next day. It will take some time for the labor pool to catch up as we experience our new normal as a country.

As of the writing of this article the 2021 Road Program is out for bids. The streets include: Edgewood (Fairway to 288), W. Willowick (Fairway to 288), Willowick Dr. (manhole boxes) Green (Clarmont to Fairway), E. 308th (Clarmont to Bayridge), Acacia (288th to Forest), Divot (Green to Fairway,

and Maplewood. We hope the bids come in within spec so we can get everything done that is planned. Hopefully the construction will begin in July and our road crew will continue to make repairs throughout the City all summer.

This is the time of year that the grass and shrubs grow very fast. Please try and keep the grass cut and bushes trimmed. Please do not leave grass clippings in the street as it can be dangerous for motorcycles or people on bicycles if it gets wet. Hi Evervone.

It is nice to see so many residents walking, riding bikes or working in their yards. Now that grass cutting season is upon us, I would like to remind everyone not to blow your grass clippings into your neighbors yard, their driveway, sidewalks or into the street and please clear the grass clipping off your sidewalk. I have seen grass clippings in the streets and on the sidewalks as I drive through the city and it is unsafe for motorcycles and people walking or children riding their bikes on the sidewalks. Grass clippings on the street end up in our sewers.

The city ordinances are in place for a reason. Please follow them. If you see someone blowing grass into the street or onto your property, take a picture or video as proof. Then send it to Sean in the Building Dept., or your councilperson so we can talk to the person. Without proof, it is your word against theirs and we cannot enforce ordinances with out proof that the person is not following them.

Reminder trash, recycle bins and yard waste are not to be placed at the curb before 4:00pm the day prior to your schedule collection day. Remove empty bins from the curb before 8:00am the following day. Please be patient with Kimble, they have a shortage of employees like most business.

If you want to read through the ordinance pertaining to grass clippings and trash go to: Ordinance 521.08 Littering and deposit or garage, rubbish junk etc. I would be happy to drop off a copy of this ordinance to you. Community College held its 54th annual commencement with Ohio Governor Mike DeWine serving as the keynote speaker. The event was held virtually on the college's YouTube channel Saturday, May 8, at 10 a.m.

"Throughout academic year, our faculty, staff and students have demonstrated a tremendous amount of courage in the face of uncertainty. This is especially true of the more than 700 graduates whose accomplishments we



Bankruptcy 101:

You are Not Your Credit Score

Question: What is your credit score and why do the lenders make such a big deal about it? How will it affect me in these times?

Answer: Back in the 1950's a company called the Fair Isaac Corp. (FICO) developed a formula which was marketed as a way for lenders to realistically evaluate their risk with regard to lending to a specific person. FICO assigned mathematical quantities to patterns of behavior (like how often one pays late, whether they have unsatisfied legal judgments, etc.) and computes those quantities

into a numerical risk factor which is known as our "credit rating." FICO sells people's credit ratings to lenders based on their FICO formula which is a trade secret and legally protected.

There are other companies like FICO which have come up with their own secret form of credit rating which they also sell to credit reporting agencies such as Equifax, Transunion and TRW. In my mind, these companies secrecy causes me to question their integrity and the efficacy of their formulas. FICO should willingly disclose the science behind their mathematical formula so it can be challenged and discussed. It only seems fair that a rating factor which affects so many people's

lives, whether it be for getting credit, a job, security clearance or the trust of another person, should be open to investigation. How do we really know its not complete voodoo?

There is a widely held belief that FICO and the entire individual credit rating system was developed by the elite to keep the middle class in their place. "Their place" is presumably in a constant state of fear over their financial rating willing to pay the banks any interest rate or penalty without question.

In our bankruptcy practice, we spend a large portion of our time helping people get back on financial track. I see people






