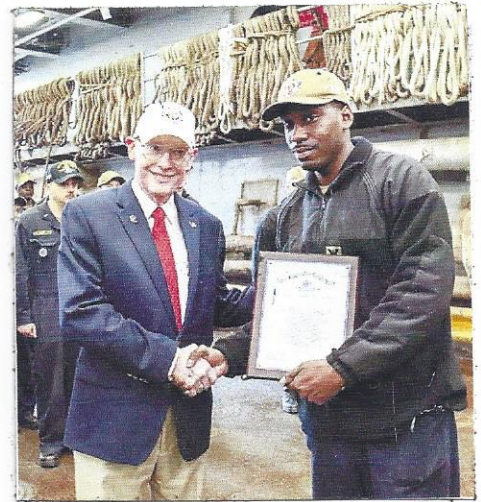


## USS CARTER HALL ALL- HANDS

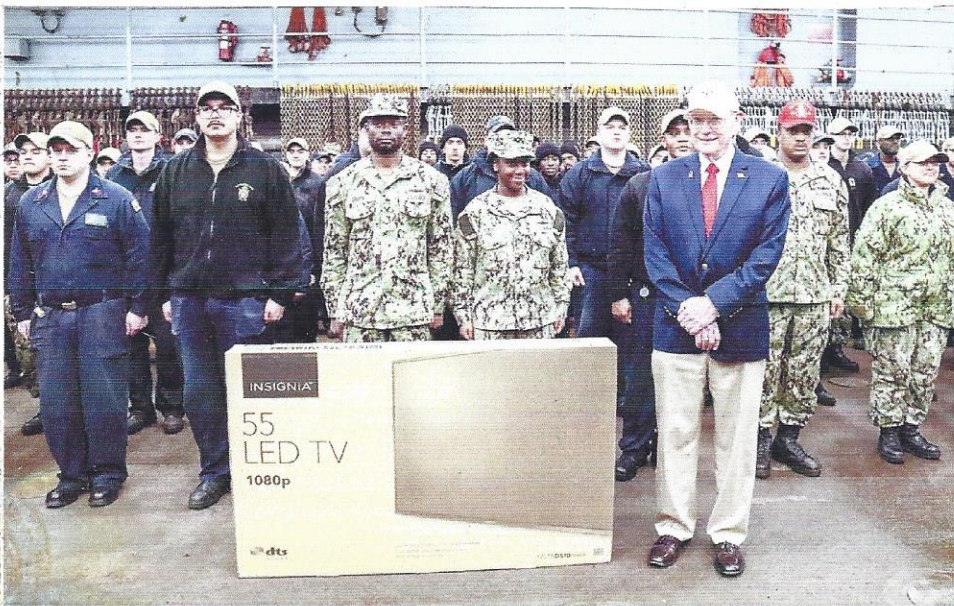

## D-DAY OBSERVANCE

In June, a large gathering of World War II veterans is planned at the National D-Day Memorial in Bedford, Virginia. This final salute: D-Day Plus 75 years will feature five days of ceremonies, to commemorate one of the most ambitious and far-reaching military campaigns in history, which was considered "the beginning of the end of war in Europe".

"The 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of D-Day is perhaps our last, best opportunity to personally thank those who were there", says Angela Lynch, associate director of marketing for the National D-Day Memorial Foundation.

Among the soldiers who landed in Normandy on 6 June 1944, was company A of the National Guard's 116<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment, 29<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division; and among their number were some 30 Bedford soldiers.

By days end, 19 of those Bedford Boys from Company A, and one from Company F, were dead. Given the county's small population, this represented the highest known per capita losses for the Nation on D-Day. Twenty other men from Bedford died later in the Normandy and France campaigns. ✍ (Note: with permission from AAA World Magazine)

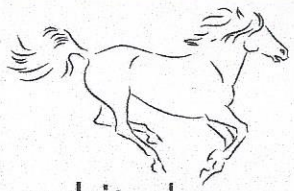

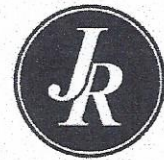

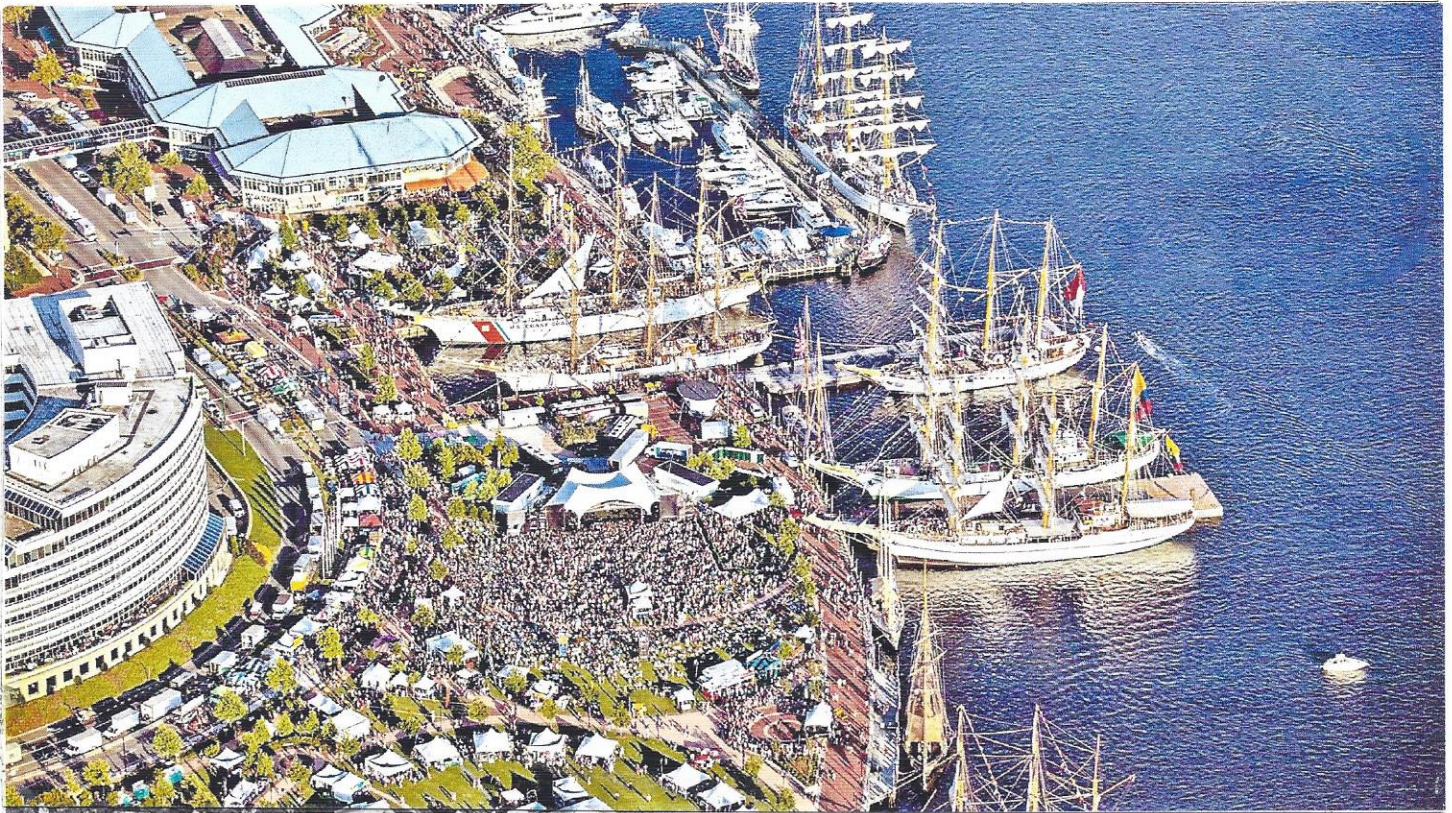

## SEA CADET INSPECTION

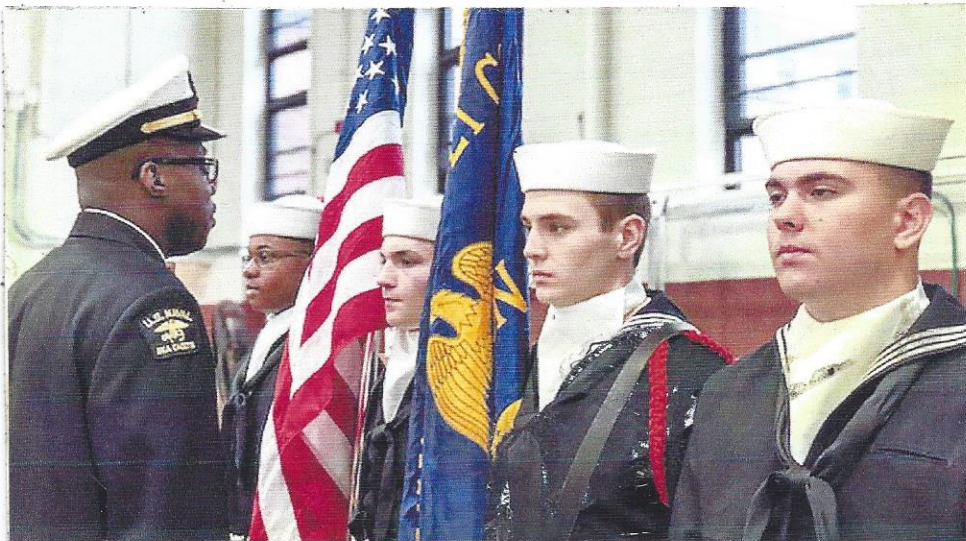

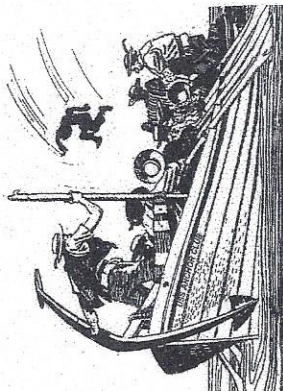
