AMANA MEAT SHOP WINS NATIONAL HONOR

The Amana Meat Shop & Smokehouse won national recognition at the American Cured Meat Championships (ACMC), held August 1-3, in Omaha, NE. This event is held in conjunction with the annual convention of the American Association of Meat Processors

The ACMC attracts participants from across the country. This year, 813 entries were received across 29 product categories, and 72 AAMP members participated in the competition. Each product is evaluated by judges who are experts in meat science and industry specialists, assessing entries on aroma, flavor, appearance, color, and texture.

The Amana Meat Shop received top honors, securing the Grand Champion award for Meat Snack Sticks Flavored and the Reserve Champion award for Jerky – Whole Muscle.

AAMP Executive Director Chris Young said, "This year's competition was particularly challenging for our judges, given the large number of entries. The overall quality was high, and the winning companies truly delivered the best of the best. On behalf of AAMP and our members, we congratulate the Amana Meat Shop for their outstanding accomplishment."

Tim Blattner, Manager of the Amana Meat Shop, shared, "The ACMC has been a prominent event for over 75 years, and we have participated in five of the last six competitions. These are our first awards at the event. Our dedicated production team reviews judges' feedback thoroughly and works tirelessly to improve each year."

THE ROOSEVELTS MEET DING DARLING

Join us for an evening with American Legends at The Amana Performing Arts Center, September 14th at 7:00 pm for this two act event, where you will hear the stories behind these two characters' lives that forged a path to historic change.

Act 1: CARTOONS & CONSERVATION: A Visit with Ding Darling This one act play was premiered at the 2016 lowa State Fair and has been in great demand ever since!

In this hour-long presentation, Jay N. "Ding" Darling visits with the audience beginning with his early years in Sioux City, where he became aware of the natural world around him, continuing on to include 2 Pulitzer Prize winning editorial cartoons for The Register, and a remarkable career as a nationally known conservationist. From the introduction of The Duck Stamp to the creation of the National Wildlife Federation, Darling's influence was felt, not only through his cartoons, but through his actions as well. Considered by many to be one of the most influential members of the modern conservation movement in the first half of the 20th century, the impact of his work is still felt today.

Act 2: Roosevelt Takes on National Parks, Conservation, & Preservation

Theodore Roosevelt describes how he felt about conservation and preservation throughout his life, how his family felt about it, and how he saved more than 200 million acres of land for future generations to enjoy.
