





### Friends,

These days, either when I drive all by myself or when I am home alone. I discover myself humming a carol, "I'm dreaming of a white Christmas; just like the ones I used to know; where the tree tops glisten and children listen to hear sleigh bells in the snow, oh the snow." During Easter-tide I will integrate the celebration of worship into joyous giving for the revitalization of the church.

# Love Offering for Missionary Hun Choi in Ukraine

### Dear Members and Friends:

As I shared updates on **Rev. Hun Choi** a

missionary to Ukraine. Rev. Choi and his wife Anna Choi have been supported by several local churches from South Korea and UMCs of USA, whose supported has been dropped since the Russian invasion to



Ukraine on February 24, as other missionaries of the entire nation were **evacuated** last spring.

Rev. Choi, US Citizen and an ordained elder of Overseas' Conference of The Korean Methodist Church was unable to leave about 30 families behind in an apartment complex in Kyiv. These remnants did not desert their hometown and decided to stay for a peaceful end of the war. With limited resources from missional support of the churches, Rev. Choi had to sell his car for funding for groceries for these 30 families.

Recently, on his way to deliver food for the isolated families in the area of Donetsk, Ukraine, Rev. Choi injured his left knee. He hopes for a surgery either in Poland or in USA in December when the rainy season begins; for the war might be slow it down. He sent a letter to the US secretary of the States to inform that he laid down his life for these innocent people under his pastoral care. We kept Rev. Choi and his missionary work in prayer over the last several months. I asked this time again if he needs any support.

According to Rev. Choi, there have been a few individual members of the Korean Methodist and United Methodist Churches, who asked him to travel to Romania to get support. The travel was impossible. None of them would like to travel to a city of Poland near to the Ukraine border, where Rev. Choi had to use a 17 hour of train trip to get help. The wire transfer has been delayed by international banking system due to a possible hacking or risks of transfer to the Russians. According to Rev. Choi, he has used debit card for his personal saving from Wells Fargo Bank. While I keep Rev. Choi in prayer, I decide to write this letter to you. If you would like to support Rev. Hun Choi, please make a check payable to Good Shepherd UMC and write a note: Support Ukraine Mission.

100% of your giving will be sent to Rev. Choi for his missional work. I will post the







The BWC members passed a **\$18,223,006** budget for 2023 that helps in the recovery from pandemic challenges and addresses the uncertainty of future changes in the denomination. The budget is based on the 90 percent collection rate proposed by the Conference Council on Finance and Administration, an increase from the 89 percent collection rate assumption in 2022.

## Pastoral Goals\* for Christ's Time for the Church

### Preamble

The one-on-one meeting between the newly appointed pastor and members of the church done in 2019, unveiled the congregational wishes to reclaim the golden days of Good Shepherd back in 1980s. From October 2019, I set a wildly important goal, namely, Good Shepherd Renaissance. Ever since I have

started a path to GSR, along with 1) transforming message; 2) financial stability; 3) evangelism and witnessing, especially for/with young people.

All the pastoral goals will focus on passion for the innovative

outreach toward all God's people, particularly 1) the Silver Sophisticated; 2) the Single Starters, and 3) the Culturally Connected.

Despite the COVID Pandemic, Good Shepherd worked hard to find out the lost sheep, to remedy biblically illiterate discipleship, and to tear down the leadership silos, so that we the Good Shepherd may thrive the mission and ministry of the church.

It has been a part-time ministry that huddle this journey to Good Shepherd Renaissance. District Superintendent Rev. Dr. Gerard Green was confident with that pastoral appointment, the full-time ministry in six month will prosper Good Shepherd.

Just before the Pandemic, I organized 4 DX execution team, envisioned "wildly important goals."

Through Disciple Study in the first year, produced a small group, called out "Four First Re**spondents**" like Andrew and Peter as well as Philip and Nathanael, to reinstate Evangelism Committee, inactive for more than a decade.

Then, the whole world shut down by the COVID Pandemic. However, Good Shepherd did not give in the wicked Pandemic. Good Shepherd reopened its in-person service along with other

online activities as early on Sunday, August 30, 2020 with hard-working **Re-entering Well** Task Force. Thus, Good Shepherd began to reclaim its renaissance, beginning with the fulltime pastoral min-

istry. Then, the Doctor of Ministry project was associated with the vision and complete in April 2021 that perfects church's discipleship pathway, by adding the 9<sup>th</sup> assimilation track of **Action and** Advocacy in Creation Care. These pastoral goals were born during the Pandemic. There are five goals. Each goal is consisted of several benchmarks, as guided by the Baltimore-Washington Conference.

Goal 1: Heading toward the Year of Multiplication, I will lead the congregation to move to "Ownership" phase of ministry, leaving beyond "Awareness" Phase. Our ultimate goal is to jump in "Fruit-bearing" phase within next 3 years.

By the end of January, the congregation will be ready to engage in the church wide evangelism work - bring one soul to faith! We have a few new families attending who are not coming from congregational evangelism work.

By February 22, Ash Wednesday, greeters - a family or a circle of friends, will be organized to serve at the entrance of the church to welcome new visitors and their continuous settlement in their new church home.

Since Easter-tide of 2022, in agreement of SPRC of Good Shepherd UMC ("Good Shepherd Campus") and The UMC of Savage ("Savage Campus"), I've stayed a Sunday of each month at Savage campus until the end of fellowship. This means developing lay ministry at least one Sunday a month with pulpit supply and other related liturgical ministries.

The first full-time ministry task force was held in September 2021 with its potentials and brainstorming. Further exploration will be made with Sunday morning patterns, the parish development, and the financial resources.

### Goal 2: As a congregational level of assimilation process, I will grow spiritual leaders.

Each year, I facilitate a few Disciple study courses as fundamental guidelines to equip spiritual leaders. Now, 1) Becoming Disciples through Bible Study for biblical literacy, 2) Under the Tree of Life for lay leadership development, and 3) Religion and Science for advocacy are being offered.

Beginning Advent of 2023, the weekly moment of commitment as "Response to the Word," will call and send the worshipers to the various areas of mission.

During the season of Epiphany, the members and friends will explore the role of the church at the verge of Anthropocene" through a short study as the doctoral project guides. The study will train the participants to create the rituals that will shape them as "Milky Way disciples of Climate Church."

In February, a "Sweetheart Luncheon" may be offered to celebrate exemplary ministries

By the end of March, Holy Club, an Young Adult Fellowship will be activated.

of the elderly members.

### Goal 3: Establish Multi-contextual Ministries

Explore the spiritual needs of the community with rapidly increasing Spanish-speaking constituents.

Develop French-speaking fellowship in the church.

Working with Health and Wellness ministry coordinator, by the end of Easter-tide, a care ministry for the aging or "the silver sophisticated" will be explored.

By the end of Kingdom-tide, I will organize a college-aged fellowship.

By the end of Kingdom-tide, an after-school program, ESOL program, etc for the culturally connected.

Working with the clergy leaders, I will seek out the collaborative work of the church to gospel of Jesus Christ in the community.


Working with cluster churches, Good Shepherd will seek out the lost in the community.

The Master's Plan will be Through Fiesta at New Hampshire Avenue, Silver Spring, MD.

### Goal 4: Financial stewardship toward tithing
