## Dear Parents/ Carers,

It is always difficult to know when to write this first newsletter of the academic year as it takes a little time for teachers to plan events and activities for the children to enjoy. However, we have now been back just over three weeks and there is lots to report!

The children have settled back into school life like ducks to water! It has been a little bit of a shock for some of our children moving into a new year group with new teachers, new expectations around learning and an increase in taking responsibility for themselves. This is perfectly normal and we find that by half term the anxiety the child may have experienced has dissipated.

# **Postponed Year 2 Camp Night**

We ended the first week back with the one-night camp night for last year's year 2 children. We were lucky that the weather held and we were able to do everything outdoors, however, it was quite a shock to realise how much the temperature drops at night in comparison to June/ July when we usually hold the event. The children were their usual well behaved group and it was enjoyable spending this very different time with them. A big, big thank you to all of the staff who supported the camp night: Mrs Verwey, Mrs Wright, Mrs O'Brien, Mrs Palmer and Mr Tierney who stayed over with the children, Chef Nye who organised all the food, Ms Pink who provided some games after supper and our own Miss Stubbs who led team games and aided in tiring them out! We are all looking forward to next summer when our new year 2s will have the same opportunity (weather permitting!).

#### Our new curriculum

This term we implemented our new topic based curriculum, which is designed to cover all of the objectives in the National Curriculum, provide progression across the year groups building on learning in the previous year and preparing for the learning in the following year and provide learning across subject areas. The following are some examples of the topics being studied.

Year 1's topic of 'Bright Lights Big City' focuses on Britain, British traditions and geography facts linked to Great Britain. The children have enjoyed afternoon tea with the Queen and a trip to the fish and chip shop!

Year 2's topic is 'Land Ahoy' and they have had a walk to the canal to see the narrowboats (not quite a pirate ship!) and a day dressed up as pirates when they built pirate ships.

Year 3 are studying 'Mighty Metals' and as part of their lessons they have visited the park to investigate pulleys and levers as well as walking to the local bridge to provide opportunities for language exploration to support their English writing.

'Bile, Burps and Bottoms' is year 3's topic when they find out about the digestive system. They have had a visit from a dentist (Maria's mummy!) when they found out how to keep their teeth, gums and mouth healthy and practiced cleaning their teeth correctly.

#### **Culture Week**

We have all enjoyed a week of colourful costumes, exotic food, dance, music and storytelling exploring the different cultures within our school community thanks to Mrs Del Grosso and some of our parents. On Thursday, we had some African visitors that worked with the children creating wall hangings and teaching them African drumming. I am hoping we can create a large wall hanging that will be hung in the library show casing the children's work.

# A few gentle reminders

I cannot emphasise enough, the importance of reading with your child every day. We have some exciting competitions to act as incentives for children to read to an adult or older sibling. Ask your child about the competitions and I am sure they will explain!

Please ensure you drive into, around and out of the carpark with extreme care, there have been a couple of near misses with some of the children. Please walk with your child when you use the zebra crossing to prevent the chance of a child running out in front of a car.

Please remember there is a one-way system when collecting your child at the end of the day (not Early Years children). This is for safeguarding reasons, as we can make sure children do not leave the school premises without an adult.

The weather is getting colder and increasingly wet; also, teachers may decide to take their class out and about the development. Please make sure your child attends school with their coat (clearly labelled!).
