

URGENT PROJECTS

NEW DORM FOR KIDS: Since June 2012 till now, the number of kids has increased from 38 kids to 63 and still increasing. We have no more space to properly accommodate for the new comers, that's why we need to create more rooms. The dorm project will fit 16 beds, 3 showers, 3 toilets, & 1 house parent room. The initial cost is USD25000 including beds & mattresses.



 <u>NEW VAN:</u> with the rising number of kids, we need more vehicles for transportations. The van will be used for the kids recreational activities & transporting goods. The cost varies from 25K to 30K USD.

Once Upon a Child

Once upon a time, a time not so long ago, there was a woman, named Fearful, who was pregnant with a baby boy. Fearful was not married so she hid from her family and friends until the baby was born.
