William "Aaron" Hetrick: I live at 3787 Stroup Rd and I have the property that is next to it too that is actually non addressed there is a space between my house and the next house. I have lived there since 2008, my wife and I and my son. The whole time that we have been there the property has been really pretty wet and we have a back pond. A while ago we put a little retention pond to try to hold all of that water because it was really really wet. In the mean time we got it all pretty much solved except for the ditches and I brought some pictures actually you can take a look at them. they start at Dick's property which is just north of us all the way through actually 2 properties down and if if you drive down that road you know that those ditches stick with water almost all of the time, the water does not move down the ditch line, I am certainly no expert in ditches. It appears the property Roland's property which is two houses down from me, he has filed in his ditch and put pipe in the ditch and the pipe is maybe 4-6 inches in diameter and it is too high so it doesn't make the ridge to go down the hill to where the house is that has the big pond behind it the stone house that has its own pond. If it would go past his property it would actually go down the hill and it would go out the natural way, which looks like the natural way. It appears like that was intended. A couple of the township guys that were just in a truck maybe a year or two ago where just driving down the road and I had them sort of like take a look and we couldn't find any pipes to take it across the road. We were thinking that it was intending to go down. I have tried everything that I could do to try to get it to move and it is just not moving, including filling in my property more, in fact actually the open property that we bought just south of us I dug a ditch, the problem is that it runs into my yard and then it runs into our open lot and then it runs into the guys property that is just south of me and it just stops at Roland's property because it is too high and it rolls back so I am certainly not trying to cause a problem, I have dealt with it. I didn't know if there was any assistance that I could get in trying to remedy or at least move the water because the issue is the water just comes up on our property and sits there stagnate. Kevin: Didn't you have D.D. ditch that for you. Aaron: He tried to make it. Kevin: You moved the ditch and you made it way to big and you moved it. We talked about this before. The only way I told you what you should do is run a pipe from there back to your retention pond and you would take your water. Aaron: I talked to some people about that and they advised me not to do that. Kevin: You messed the ditch up when you had somebody come in there with an excavator and you moved the ditch back and you would have to move it all the way forward but you have a big hole there right now. Aaron: This wasn't new, he did try to widen the ditch a little bit and make it deeper to hold the water in the ditch and then we filled the back part of it, the ditch wasn't ever moved it was just actually literally. The ditch had basically gone away, it was just ramped into the yard basically and the water was all right through there, there was so much that there was actually cat tails before, but we filled a lot of it in and that is actually not the problem, the problem is farther down the line when you go south you go all the way through my other lot which there is not ditch at all anymore and then until you get past

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Brayden's to Roland's his pipe is too little and it is too high so the water will be about ready to go into his pipe and it is too high and it flows back and it also flows out through the ditch west onto the Braden Property, clear into his yard and everything whenever it is pretty wet and he would like to get it remedied too. I would like a ditch to be ditched down through there and it is something to address, I mean if you don't go through Roland's that is fine, but I would like the water not to be in my ditch all of the time.

Chris: I am trying to picture where he is at Kevin. Kevin: He is, do you know where Dick's live, Matt Dicks. Chris: Yeah. Kevin: He is the property right next to him. Dennis' boy dug a pond in the back and they had a bunch of trouble after they dug it because all of that water ran over onto the neighbor's property and then they opened that ditch up from Dicks' to his property and then it goes into his next property, well he made that ditch like a pond almost in the front and then deep, if you go down the road because there is a cross over, I think that there is a cross over the hump there, it goes across the street right there and it is not going to go up to the way he is talking because it is coming back this way from the top of that hill and comes back down towards and meets in the middle and the cross over there. Aaron: Regardless it is not moving. Chris: That lot that you are talking about has been laying wet since the beginning of time. Aaron: I understand that. Kevin: He built the pond back there, his best bet would be to take it back to his pond that he has already created. Aaron: The problem with that is that you get the road, the stuff coming off the road and I actually talked to a biologist about it and he said that I shouldn't do that because that water coming off of the road the salt, I have fish in there too, god forbid that there is a wreck or gas or oil or any type of thing coming in through those ditches off of that road is going to go into my pond. Chris: The salt and that kind of stuff is so minimal that it would never bother the pond. Kevin: It is going to end up at somebody's pond somewhere whichever way that you take it. So we talked about this a year ago and you had somebody come out there and open that ditch up and we come out and tried to fix it a little bit and you would have to create a back wall to it now, because you moved it and it like a pond there almost. Aaron: The ditch itself where you are talking about is just on the northern part of my property and that is the only part that he actually touched at all and it is literally only 3/4 foot by 12 ft the run of the ditch. It is a little deeper and bigger, I certainly wouldn't describe it as a pond. The problem is not necessarily that as much as that is not where the only water is, I would fill that back up tomorrow if I thought that would fix the problem, but the problem is that the water would just push farther south and then the next ditch and into the ditch where my property is that you were saying about and then onto Brayden's property, there is no ditch at all, like it literally just steers right off of the road. That water just literally goes straight into our yards and then if it gets too bad actually maybe a month or 3 weeks ago, it was actually over top of Matt Dixson's driveway too. It had that much water pushed back through.

Chris: A lot of water goes down through there and that area is somewhat flat. Kevin: We are getting ready to do Matt's Driveway, he wants new pipe put in, we go by and he hasn't bought it yet so. We are going to put a catch basin in at the end of his driveway, but see that will just put more water over onto you. Aaron: I get that all of the water has to go somewhere, I would rather that it not just be sitting there stagnate in that ditch because that is not really all that healthy. Kevin: We can come out and look at it again and try to look and see what we could do, but it is not going to be anytime real soon. Chris: Kevin can come and take a look at it and see what he thinks, you also have to understand and I know that you have been saying that it has been an ongoing problem but It has been a long time since it has been this wet for this long also. Kevin: We will look at it again and we could open up some ditches down through there but. Tim: Is the cross over not lower than that ditch, Is it higher than that ditch? Kevin: I have to go back out there and look at it again. Aaron: It never flows, It literally just sits there stagnate, even when it is filled all of the way up through there, I am not sure exactly where you are talking about by cross over but, you actually never see water flowing down the ditch in any fashion, It just sits there until basically goes through the ground or dissipates some of it rushes off into my yard and Brayden's yard and then it sort of dissipates over time, it never gets to wherever it needs to cross or whatever. Chris: So you are thinking that Roland's pipe is actually

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blocking it up. Aaron: It never gets to Roland's pipe because he has built the ground up and then he put a 4", or maybe 6" pipe in there and it is too high. Chris: That is what I'm saying, that pipe is holding the water back. Aaron: Once it gets to that point absolutely. Like right now today, when you look at the pictures the water has receded a little bit because it hasn't rained for a couple of days, but a couple days when it rained a lot, it had gotten almost to that pipe, then the pipe is too high and it pulls back. Kevin: We can come out there and look at it again, we looked at it a year ago it just seemed like you made a mess when you had someone else in there ditching it. I can come out there and look at it again and take some shots and see what we can do with it. Aaron: I appreciate it. Chris: We will take a look at it. Aaron: OK, Thank you. Appreciate it. Jeffrey: Does he have a 6" pipe running the ditch. Kevin: I don't know when anybody put one in. I don't know what is in it, we had walked around that property looking for a pipe and never found a pipe where he is talking about. The hill is coming down this way because that house that he is talking about at the top of the hill there that sits back in there is a pond over it, but then everything is coming down this way backwards. He caused a lot of trouble back there, he dug that pond or Dennis' boy dug that pond for him and then all of that water went over on the neighbor's pond and those guys came to the meeting and I called Soil and Water and they were supposed to deal with all of that, this was a year or two ago. Chris: So it seems like to me that to get it to go over top of that hump there that is going to be a pretty massive ditch. Kevin: Oh Yeah. Chris: If I am picturing it right. Kevin: To get up over top of that hump it is going to have to be real deep to get over the hump where he wants it to go. It is all coming backwards. We can go out and take a look at it again and I told him once he gets over that hump over there at the bottom then there is a cross over culvert and then it goes in behind, I am not sure who lives in McClellan's' old place that brick house there. Kevin: It is going to have to be a deep hole to get underneath because it is going uphill basically. We dug on both sides of that yard them two yards and we couldn't find no pipe and I told him that he has a pond, just to run a pipe back there and get rid of the water but he doesn't want to do that, he had a big mess out there because he dug that pond like a said and he caused, there was already a pond there and then he dug his pond which flooded other people's ponds. Chris: Well in the first place all of them people built way back in off the road on purpose because there was water laying there whenever they built. Kevin: It has always been wet, so they built back away from the water and then he had them guys come in Dennis with his excavator and they tried to fix that ditch and all he made was a pond basically out front. Rhonda: It looks almost like a wet land and wet lands usually stay that way forever. Jeffrey: Why don't we go out and take a look at it again and then if you need to send Water and Soil out.

III. CORRESPONDENCE:

A. Chris: This letter was in my box I am not necessarily going to read it complaining about T and A Pallet, but the letter is not signed, no return address or anything all they are doing is complaining about it and we all complain about it. Rhonda: I can address all of that when you get to me. Chris: OK, I don't give them necessarily much credibility if they are not going to sign it or anything else.

B. As far as this \$50.00 donation, that wasn't much of a donation to be put on the plaque. We said before that it wasn't very much of a donation to put their name on the plaque to do something up there at the chapel, I was going to talk to the family this is the same family that their boy just died also in that car accident, I really haven't had a chance to really talk to them about this, but I am going to talk to them and see what they really want us to do with the money or if they would like to donate a little bit more that we could really purchase something up there that is needed. I am not sure, I said before that I would also talk to Kevin and see if there is anything that we would like to purchase up there for the \$50.00, I suppose that there is a possibility of that, but \$50.00 doesn't buy very much of a lasting gift. So let me still talk to these people and then I will make a note of it and make sure that I talk to them before our next meeting and then we will. Bill: I can write a check to reimburse them.

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C. Chris: I guess maybe Rhonda that we will go into this T and A Pallet. Rhonda: I went to court, I went up there, because I wanted to meet Chris and the new guy and get an understanding, I have never attended a hearing, I talked to Chris and Brent Bencze. It is already in Kuntzs' name according to the Auditor. It had just been canceled off of the foreclosure list anyway, it was also under foreclosure which I didn't know either. Kuntz already has it, the daughter has it it is done. So we talked the people that owned T and A pretty much are going to get away with whatever they did, it kind of lands into Mikes lap because it goes with the property. I asked if there was any way to get anything back from them. He said no, I think that is just done. So we talked about it and he is going to contact Mike because it is Kuntz Enterprises, we talked about giving them to like August to get it cleaned up, It is not a long time but we need to give them some time there is a lot there and i don't think that he wants it to look like that either anyway. Is that what the letter says? Chris: No, this technically doesn't have to much to do with us but according to this if I am getting it right why T and A Pallet his lawyer must have quit on him but e is another hearing July 23rd. Did they say anything? Rhonda: He basically said that it was Kuntzs' problem now, that is what he had said to me while we were standing there. Bill: At the time he owned it when the fine occurred or did Kuntz own it the whole time? Rhonda: Right, No. Bill: So just because they sell doesn't mean they are out. Rhonda: He made it sound like it was just a wash, why isn't he responsible for past fees that occurred. Chris: It says please find enclosed a copy of a motion to withdrawal as council of record that has been forwarded to Portage County Common Pleas for filing. I am going to send this on down to you Rhonda and you can put it with the file, but I would also maybe call him and see what this means about another hearing. He said basically said that it falls into Kuntzs' responsibility now. I didn't know when he was going to be taking possession, because I asked that question too, but he is already the owner so why are they still doing pallet stuff. I was going to go talk to Tara at Furniture that is the only person that I knew how to get in touch with, I just haven't made it there yet. Tim: Oh, He is still going in and out of there? Rhonda: He is still doing business, I heard July. Chris: I thought that maybe he would let him do business out of there, but I agree I have seen him bringing stuff in still. Rhonda: So I don't know what was in the Sales Agreement I wasn't privy to that information, but according to the auditor Kuntz Enterprises is the owner of the land. Tim: But you have seen him hauling stuff in still. Chris: Debbie did, I guess that I shouldn't have said that. Kevin: I seen him going up this way with a load of pallets. Rhonda: I mean he really shouldn't be. I really just wonder why he is still there. Jeffrey: Is there any type of cease and desist order put on the property so that they could not. Rhonda: No. All seen is that the ownership changed, which puts it into Kuntz Enterprises lap. Jeffrey: We should be asking the prosecutors to do that or talk to them about that anyway, to make so that they can't take any more in there, if he does no matter who the owner is a violation. Rhonda: I will see what I can do about that, no body is really quick about that stuff. Chris: Ask them if they could at least do that, if they still have business heading out, I guess that would be a win win situation for everybody, but they shouldn't be allowed to be bringing any more pallets in I wouldn't think. Rhonda: I totally agree, I was going to go down there and talk to them. Chris: That might be good too. See if we can get some information from Kuntzs' too. Rhonda: They would probably be more likely to give me information and Tara is usually pretty good about telling me stuff. Chris: That is the other thing we are going to get way further with Kuntzs' than we have ever gotten with T and A. Rhonda: When I talked to Chris he wasn't to worried about T and A. He was more worried about the property who is going to do what we started out with needing done is what he was worried about.

D. Chris: This is from the Parks and Recreation Committee about the Bicentennial stuff. Bill: Right I just put a copy in your guys' box so you knew what was going on. Tim: That is the fundraiser they sent out to the businesses. Chris: Do you guys have any problems with it, how this read or anything with it. Tim: No. Jeffrey: I didn't have a chance to read over the whole thing yet, I just glanced over it when I got it. We can discuss it a little bit tonight. Bill: So far we received \$1,000. from Edinburg Auction Sales, I believe that we are receiving \$505. from Edinburg United Church and I got a check for South East Co-op

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have it up on both boards up and down the road so everybody knows or we are going to get hung up, so we need to have a backup plan. Kevin: I talked to Mike Devar this morning he called me because I called him yesterday and was going to dig into this, next Wednesday they milling the road and paving, Wednesday, Thursday, whatever next week and he said that they were working real hard to get it so that we could have our parade on 14. Tim: The problem is that ODOT is going to come back. Kevin: He is ODOT, he is the inspector. He told me that they are working real hard and he is hoping that the barrels will be gone and everything for the route will be done, he called me this morning and said that he got them all on board and they were going to try and do everything that they can to make it work. Tim: This is ODOT district Dave Kineble, that is the guy that I spoke to. Jeffrey: It doesn't hurt for us to have an alternate just in case and it is not going to take much to do that, the problem is that we would have to be jumping through hoops to get everything transitioned from down there, down to the park, the park would make the most logical place to have it. Tim: Do we still go from here to the park do you think? Chris: I would. Tim: That way line them up in the street and down here and then use the churches for parking. Jeffrey: Then we would just head on down through to the park, instead of heading out the other way. Tim: Then just the Fire Trucks just couldn't turn in, everybody else could go into the park and get turned around but maybe not the Fire Trucks, because they would get bogged down in there pretty easy don't they. Jeffrey: If they get in the wrong place they will. Kevin: The only time that they got bogged down is when they were trying to go through all that traffic. Tim: Well that is what I mean everybody in there where else are they going to go? Rhonda: They don't go into the cemetery anyway, do they? Chris: No. Tim: No, that is what I am saying. Jeffrey: The trucks do go through the cemetery. Our trucks go to the cemetery. The other trucks are just going to go on by they are not going to go in, so the only Fire Trucks that we need to be concerned with are ours. Rhonda: Our buses go down into the park as well. Tim: is that what we want to do? Jeffrey: I think that we should set it up as an alternate plan with the intentions of going the regular route, that is what my thoughts would be. Tim: As soon as for some reason they say, as soon as I find out I will call the two of you and if we can't if they are going to say no then we will make up some signs, get some plywood, paint them up and put them at the center of town, new route and it will be over to the park. Rhonda: Put it on Facebook, Twitter all of that stuff. Tim: I understand but there are some older people too that. Rhonda: I see both sides of this. Jeffrey: Well we got beat up from all directions on that trash day. We got beat up on Facebook. Tim: I don't have it so I didn't hear any of it. Jeffrey: So the alternate route will be down to the park. Chris: Parking it will just be a free for all parking they will just be parked along Rock Spring as they go, I don't see why you would even change any of it. We will just set up like we ordinarily would and come right from here and head out, instead of coming this direction we are just going to head that direction. Kevin: We would just put the tent up with the awning there. Rhonda: How receptive would Pettigrew's be to putting something like that on their sign? Jeffrey: Well I was going to actually ask them, because I think that sign is very visible and very noticeable and I will talk to Lonnie. I was thinking about that but I wasn't going to bring it up until I talked to him. The other thing is I would look into one of those signs for us. Rhonda: We could stay more up to date and stuff on there wouldn't stay after it already happened. Jeffrey: Even if you put something on our sign it is like. Tim: They are nice they put one in Randolph and I don't think that Lonnie has the problems that like Randolph has a horrible time. Rhonda: We need to get a good one though because when they are not. The school has one and a cheap one and they were talking about it on the way to Columbus, how the lights weren't really good. Jeffrey: Lonnie has his now for like 6/7 years and when he bought it, it was like \$28,000, for the two sided sign but it is 8 years old. Tim: I think that they are actually cheaper than they used to be when they first. Jeffrey: I saw the schools and it was doomed to get damaged. Rhonda: What they said is that they won't fix it. It is unfix-able. Kevin: Rootstown has a nice one and Brimfield has a nice one. Jeffrey: Yeah but I don't think that they would like it if we took it. Tim: Since we are on the parade. Are you going to announce again Chris? Chris: I can. Tim: They would like two of us to hand out pamphlets again. Are you going to put your car in the

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parade again, what are you thinking? Chris: Probably. Tim: So do you want Jeff and I to do pamphlets? Chris: Yeah. Tim: Is that alright with you? Jeffrey: Yes. Tim: You're going to do table and chairs and. Kevin: It will be done and remember we need extra ones for the American Legion Guys, because they will need to sit down and take a break. The other thing is I need you to open that Chapel up, I need a key to the Chapel so that the bus ladies can get in and get cooled off. There were some ladies that wanted in there and I didn't have a key. Rhonda: It wasn't me. Tim: There were some ladies that wanted in there and I didn't have a key and I thought that I was going to get strung up. The other thing is what would you think about putting a Porta John in the Cemetery if we are going to go to the Cemetery, even just for Memorial Day, because there are so many people there, there is no restroom for them. Rhonda: I have been there done that, little kids have to go take them behind a tree. Jeffrey: You know I think that is a good idea. Tim: Even if we just do it for the weekend. Chris: Why don't we just do it for two weeks. Kevin: As soon as I find out that it is down there, we should know by the end of the end of the week. Tim: Is that enough time to have them get one out there? Kevin: I can call them. Chris: I would do it no matter what, that way it would be there, I would do it for two weeks. Kevin: I will have them put it up by the Chapel. Tim: Park Committee is doing a Community Yard Sale we are going to lead with the church, correct Bill? Bill: Yes. Tim: That will be June 15th. Rhonda: Is that at the Church? Tim: It will be at the Church. Bill: The Church is selling tables, we are giving the Community options if they want to do it at their house they give us their address and information we will have a map that we will give out at the Church for other residents. Jeffrey: Do you guys have the vehicles lined up? Tim: Shannon does that, Linda Dillon is going to talk to Haws about that, I think Shannon. Bill: I did talk to John Hayes he said that he would help with that line up. Tim: Will he direct it? Bill: Yes, he said that he would. Tim: Cool. Rhonda: I think that our troop is going to talk to the other troop about who is carrying what, I think that the other troop. Jeffrey: They are actually going to have a float. Tim: Do you remember who was going to get a hold of Haws was it Shannon, do you remember? Bill: I got assigned the garage sale and to talk to John or Sandy. Tim: I will get a hold of Linda and Shannon. I know that one of them is doing it and I can't remember which one. Bill: They had me changing that letter, I was in and out of there. Jeffrey: Is the same person that was doing the trophy's doing the trophy's again? Tim: Yes. Jeffrey: Doing the names and putting the labels on them. Bill: I think they are using that place in Kent by the Movie Theater in Kent. Jeffrey: Make sure that they spell Grand Marshal correctly. Bill: Whether is is British spelling? Jeffrey: It seems kind of silly but believe me I hear about it, every year. Bill: I have people call and give me all of these corrections. Tim: Who are we using for the Trustees award? Chris: I have mentioned Dan Francis. Tim: Dan Francis, OK. Just in-case. It Francis, or don't you know the spelling, because I want to make sure that it is correct. Jeffrey: Have we talked to him yet? Chris: No, but I will talk to Bob. Jeffrey: You need to talk to him. Tim: Then as soon as you find out for sure Chris, I will let Jody know so she can pick it up. Rhonda: Yes, Francis, is correct.

IV. TRUSTEE REPORTS:

A. Tim: Well I talked to you guys about the holding tank and the hot water tank for the concession, is there anything that I need, is there anything that zoning requires for putting sinks. Rhonda: Nope. Bill: Is there anything for the Record? Jeffrey: Nothing yet for the record. Tim: I can't do anything until I get final approval, I have to have all of that lined up with the health department before I can even start moving. Jeffrey: Do we have any type of a funding estimate? Tim: Until I, I needed to get all of that so that I can go and tell him what I need, in-case zoning required something, I have to talk to Jesse and I will find out if the Fire Department is going to require anything and then once I know all of that then I can get an estimate. Chris: But your friend didn't give you any kind of, he is going to by the next meeting once I tell him, I need to make sure that zoning and Fire Department, I have already been through the building department and all of that, but I need to know what zoning needs and if the Fire needs anything. As long as I have verbal waivers from them then he will put together everything and give me an estimate and then

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we can go from there and decide if that is what we want to do, and then I will get three prices. Jeffrey: Is there anything that we need from the building department? Tim: No there is nothing going on structurally so we are not going to need anything from them. Jeffrey: OK, I just wanted to make sure. Chris: So I guess proceed on and see.

B. Jeffrey: We touched on it a little bit I think as part of our, what I would like to see us do is see trash day as part of our first meeting in January on the agenda to set the date at that point. Tim: OK. Jeffrey: And that way we can get it out ahead of time and make sure that we have everything. That is about the only thing. Schedule it early so that we are there. Tim: The guys and I are going to come in on Sunday morning early and put the flags up, so they are going to get a little bit of overtime if that is OK with you guys. Chris: That is fine. Jeffrey: That is probably about the safest time to do it. Tim: That is why Sunday, During the week it is just too dangerous, so we are going to do real early in the morning on Sunday. Jeffrey: The only other question that I have is did the paper mess up on us or did we mess up not getting it into the paper for the trash day? Bill: Did you say that it was in there? Jeffrey: I didn't see it nobody saw it. Bill: I called the editor Heather Rainone, I called somebody else at the front desk, they don't have that Cathleen for Around Edinburg anymore and then I filled out.... they have a place in there where you fill out like a local news article, so I filled that out too. I was on vacation that week as well. Chris: I think from here on stuff like this Bill even if it costs us money we are going to have to just take an ad out. Bill: But I needed someone to return the call to even know where to post it. Jeffrey: So next year we will follow up on that end and if. Tim: And we will know earlier next year too. Jeffrey: We can make it all set up. I just wondered, because I knew that the plans were to put it in and get it in and the plans were to get it up on the sign, I just want to make sure that we kind of close the loop a little better. Of course I may not have to worry about it next year, it all depends if I get enough votes or not. Chris: If we get some of that extra stuff it would just be a little bit extra advertisement, but we are going to have to make sure that we get that in. Bill: I was told to fill out that report form so, that is what I did and then I was still waiting to hear from Heather the Editor to get back to me.

Rhonda:(discussing signs at the recycling containers) It couldn't be more than \$40.00, to get signs made that say the stuff that you have on that little easel thing that you have out there and put it on the fence. Like at the print shop, like no dumping, no trash, no...., it would look more professional out there. Look into one up at the print shop and write down what you want. Kevin: We think that when people come in that they would see that better. Rhonda: I don't know I was just trying to. Chris: Even if we put it on an easel a sign would probably look better anyway. If you have a chance Kevin write down what it is. Before we go into department reports we have some new guests come in did you guys need something or just here. Jody: We are here for softball, they just told me to come here as a rep and ask if we could host Ball on Sundays, we need a township or a group to be able to host, they can't find any park space for Portage County to host D Ball Girls. Jeffrey: This is that Sunday deal. Chris: Are you guys part of Edinburg Softball Jodi: Yes. Justin Morris is the Rep and I am just his wife. I am on the Park Committee. We just wanted to make sure that we asked. Chris: We will be honest, we heard rumors through the grape vine that this was just some group of teens out here floating in midair and didn't necessarily have anything to do with Edinburg. Jodi: Well it is a group of teens but it is Portage County, we just like last year we didn't have a team and we don't have a team, we basically used it as a way to earn money through our concession stand, we hosted it, we paid for the lines for the fields and they did that, we hosted it and just made the concession stand off of it, because Portage County cannot find anywhere because it is double headers, so when they have double headers they have to have all of those teams there and just do one game right after another, so there is not one other organization in Portage County that meets. Tim: Did we do it last year? Jodi: Yes, we did do it last year. Jeffrey: We did it here last year? Jodi: Yes, we did do it here last year. Chris: what about liability insurance do they carry a liability? Jodi: I believe that the league carries a liability insurance, when I have seen the report from the actual league and then I know like we do carry insurance also, but the league carries insurance. Chris:

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It sounds to us like maybe it is a little bit of a Grey area, whether they are actually part of Edinburg. Tim: It sounds like we are just hosting. Jodi: We are just hosting, they are not. Tim: You are doing it almost just like a fundraiser. Chris: Which is fine, I guess is what we would like to see is a copy of their liability insurance, because I know Edinburg Hot Stove has a liability insurance that we have been showed a copy of in the past and I guess I think don't you guys think that we need that we need that. Tim: How many Sundays is it? Jodi: I think that they only play six Sundays because they start so late. D Ball is older girls that are in High School so they can't even start until High School season is completely finished. Tim: They are also making some contribution to paying for the lining and all of that stuff. Tim: Well that is a better picture of it than we have had before. Chris: I don't have a problem with it as long as we can get a copy of the liability insurance. Jeffrey: I am not really in favor of it tell you the truth. We do for Edinburg because it is Edinburg related type thing and we want to make sure that we support the community in any way that we can or at least that is my thoughts on it, but when we start going outside of the community then we are opening it up to the next person that says hey you let them do it, we want to do it too, so that is where my problem is. Tim: Like I said I think that it is fundraiser basically, I understand what you are saying. Jeffrey: And I can tell you as far as insurance and I agree that we need to see it but it is my opinion whatever the liability waiver is it better not be anything less than a million dollars. That is my thoughts on it. Jodi: I know last year some weekends we made 300/400 dollars off of the concession stand. Jeffrey: I am not saying that, what we have to do is no matter what, we have to protect the township and we know where our teams are at so we don't know where this team is really at, it is like Chris said we need to see something along the lines of liability, but in my opinion it should be at least a million dollars, and that really isn't that expensive to have a million-dollar liability. Tim: has this started yet or when does it start? Jodi: It hasn't started yet; I don't know the actual. Rhonda: Is there a reason that they aren't on a regular team. Jodi: We do not have a D ball. Rhonda: The girls have High School softball; do they have to graduate high school or are those girls not interested in having. Jeffrey: It is a traveling league isn't it? Jodi: No, It is like Rootstown has one team and Garrettsville might have one other team, it really is just 6 Portage County teams, the problem is when you start getting to D ball you either have kids that legitimately travel or travel far. The ones that want to stay local, there is not enough kids to make up in our community to have one team is what ends up happening and so you will get a few kids from different organizations all come together and they just join. When my daughter gets old enough there is not enough here, she has to go play for Rootstown, so that is kind of how it works. Tim: So there are Edinburg kids on these teams? Jodi: I have not seen the roster, but that is what ends up happening, they are put together by small groups and they join in one community, they come together and have enough kids to put together a D ball team. Like this is the first year my daughter has even been able to play in Edinburg she always ended up playing in Palmyra because we have never had enough girls in her age group to play. We brought her back because we finally had enough kids in Edinburg that have been willing to play in Edinburg so finally I was able to have my own kid play where I live. It just seems to happen more with these older girls, some lose interest and go into other directions. I don't know who is on their rosters, because I haven't got to see their rosters, I just know that there are usually about 6 groups of D ball. Tim: Why don't you just put together the insurance information and let us see it and that will give us some time to digest it and then we can make a decision, you want to do that? Would that be alright? Jeffrey: Yes, we will go over it. Tim: This is not a traveling team coming together this is just, it sounds to me like the next stop up from what the kids are doing now, they just don't have a place to play. Jeffrey: One of the other things that I would like to know is how many ball fields do they tie up when they come in? Jodi: Well because they are D ball kids they are older girls they can only use like 3 or 4 fields that could accommodate girls hitting that far. Jeffrey: Is that a 45 ft pitch? Jodi: I think that it is. So we really can't have any of the other fields because some of them are so close. Jeffrey: Well if you would help us on that give it to us or give it to Tim or any of us and then we could take a good look at it and then we will

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go from there. Chris: If you can't make it up to a meeting just make sure that we get a copy of that. Jodi: OK, I will get a copy of our insurance and then get it to you. Chris: OK. Tim: Thank you very much.

V. DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

A. Kevin Biltz- Roads/Buildings/Cemetery/Park Report: We got our salt that we had contracted. We figure that we have right now we are probably sitting on about 300 tons of salt out there in our building, it looks pretty full. We got 50 tons of the 60 tons that we had contracted less the 10 % that we are allowed. We got \$326.00 for the scrap metal. We took some down afterwards, we took some down afterwards, we were cleaning up a little bit. We filled 3 dumpsters with trash and 2 dumpsters with tires. We had 4 tires out here Monday morning when we come to work, we took them over to Stuebenville and got rid of them right away. The Park we have just been mowing, trying to stay ahead. I got stuck yesterday and had to leave the tractor there all night, because Nate was off yesterday. His girlfriend graduated from college so all the way back in the back of that place it got stuck, that is along walk to the front. It was easy to get out I just didn't have anybody to help pull it out. We had 2 burials and one cremation. We got the cemetery weed eaten and finished that up. Tim: How many burials is that? Kevin: 13 Tim: You are in second place in lower Portage County.

B. Jesse Baughman/Fire Department- Jeffrey: Total Fire runs for the month of April is 37 we had 0 Fire, EMS 28, Mutual Aid given 2, Mutual received 1, 2 motor vehicle crashes, open burns and grass fires we had 5, 2 service calls. Total number as of the end of April 141, 45 calls more calls than last year at the same time. EMS training with UH is going to be on May 20th 2019, Fire Training with new irons was at FD on Monday May 6th, 6 Members will be attending joint training at Atwater Fire Department which you have a copy of what the training is going to be it is real car incident response, I would like to publicly thank the citizens of Edinburg for their continued support of the Fire Department for renewing our tax levy, the Fire Department will be participating in mock accidents at Southeast High School Friday May 10th weather permitting. That is the end of his report. The only other thing that we need to discuss would be Tom Eland, tom is still on Atwater Fire Department, he just wanted to join Edinburg he still runs with Suffield, he would like to just be a member, he can be call back so on and so forth, I didn't see anything that was detrimental and with communication with Jesse, he feels very positive about his abilities, he just finished his Fire Fighter 2 class, he had actually talked to Jesse about coming onto Edinburg a while ago and he was actually interviewed by the Officers at that time, the reason why he wasn't brought forward was he was just starting his Fire Class and they wanted him to complete it before he came on board. Chris: So he has no intentions on doing duty crew or anything. Jeffrey: He will do some duty crew. Tim: A lot of these young guys that I have talked to in Randolph they worked at three departments, I didn't realize that until recently, they told me that. Jeffrey: I just meant that he is close, that he would be close enough that he can actually do a call back and that is one of the nice things about it. In my opinion I would like to make a motion to approve him for his probationary period and get his necessary paperwork.
