

## Intake Questions

This list is intended to be a starting point for collecting information at intake.

Laterality-Whenever more than one of the same anatomical (symmetrical) structure exists, document the side that is affected or if the condition is bilateral. For example, wound/ulceration, arteriosclerosis, venous stasis, arthritis, amputations, paresis and paralysis all require the side that is affected.

Duration-Is the condition new or old? Acute or chronic? Exacerbated? Note a condition may still be acute.
